





Provide targeted individualized tutoring for Elementary and Middle School students outside the school day using contracted services.





# TEMPORARY VIRTUAL LEARNING OPTION (TVLO)


- Extended TVLO for the Spring semester

## REMOTE CONFERENCING UPDATE

- Learning option for students in quarantine
- Available to students in grades K-8
  - K-5: 2 hours Synchronous and 2 hours Asynchronous
  - 6-8: 4 hours Synchronous
- Training for campuses
   Training will be complete by February 25th
- Launch March 7th



# STEM MOBILE INNOVATION LABS

- The goal of the CTE Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) mobile innovation labs is to increase student interest in STEM-related career pathways.
- The labs provide equitable access to STEM for at K-8 campuses throughout the district.
- Currently there are two trailers and we plan to launch two more later this year.
- **34** campuses visited (as of February 2022)
- 14,788 students engaged

#### PARENT PARTNERSHIPS

- ESSER funds were used to hire more than 98 Family Engagement Specialist to support all elementary and middles schools.
- Family Engagement Specialists make daily attendance and warm calls to our families to strengthen relationships and reduce absenteeism.
- To date, over **62,000** calls to our families have been logged with the goal of embracing our families and bring awareness of the importance of attendance in a non-punitive format.

## SAFE RETURN TO IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION

- The District was required to create a Safe Return to In-person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan.
- This plan must be reviewed and revised as needed every six months with input from District stakeholders.
- Stakeholders were invited to provide feedback using an online survey.










What do you believe are the highest priority needs for Fort Worth ISD to address learning recovery and the impact of COVID-19? (2,062 Responses)
