Software Update on the MacBook

Introduction

Apple continuously provides software updates to the MacBook. An update is a newer version of the currently installed macOS, such as an update from macOS Monterey 12.5 to macOS Monterey 12.6. An upgrade is a new version of macOS with a new name, such as an upgrade from macOS Monterey to macOS Ventura. This quick reference guide will provide support on how to install software updates and upgrades on the MacBook.

Getting Started

1. Click on **System Preferences** (**System Settings** on Ventura). This can be located in the **Dock** or **Launchpad**.



The location of the Software Update option differs based on the current macOS version.

macOS Monterey

The System Preferences app on macOS Monterey looks like the image below.



2. Click Software Update.



macOS Ventura

The System Preferences app on macOS Ventura looks like the image below.

2. Click General.



3. Click **Software Update**.





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Upgrading the macOS

4. Click on the **Upgrade Now** button.



5. Click the blue **Agree** button on the Software License Agreement window.



6. Enter the active directory **password** used to log into the MacBook and click the **OK** button.



The download will take several minutes. The MacBook will install the system upgrade automatically.

During installation, the MacBook might show a progress bar or blank screen several times. Avoid putting it to sleep or closing the lid.
