- Sees something wrong and works to make it right.



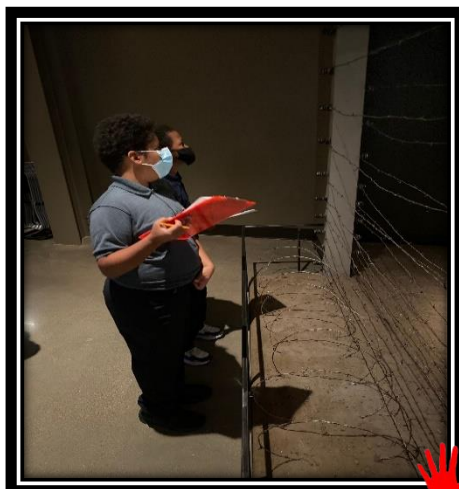

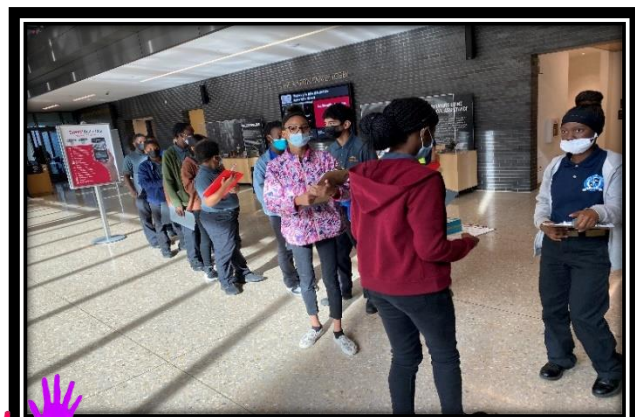

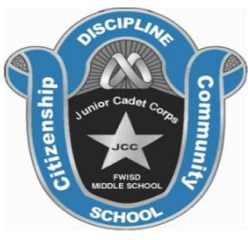

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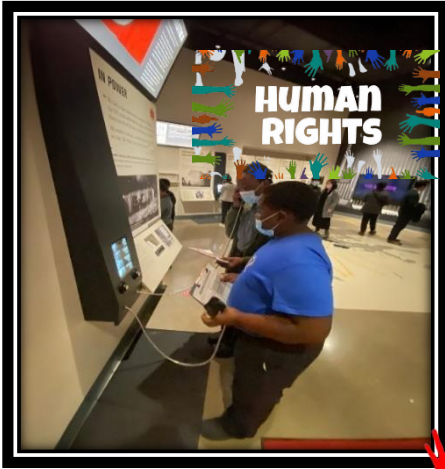

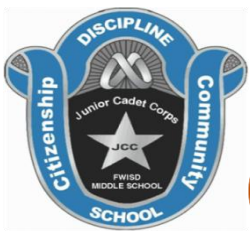

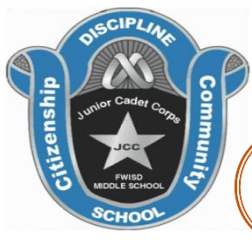

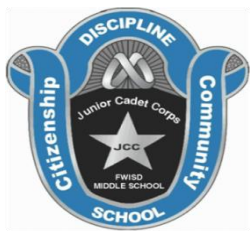

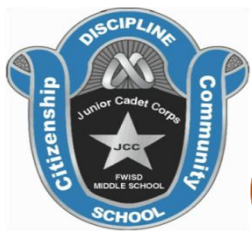

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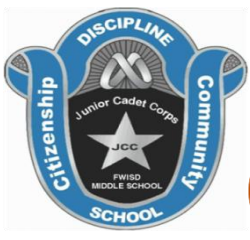

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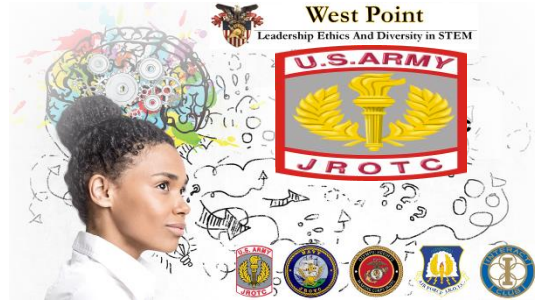
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## WE ARE ONE



One of the mission of the LEAD STEM is to increase the recruitment and retention of under-represented minorities and disadvantaged youth populations in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). This mission is aligned with the national need to increase the number of STEM experts, for a shortage of talent threatens the country's ability to drive innovation, compete internationally, and protect national security. This national need coincides with a need from within the United States Army for officers with a higher level of scientific and technological literacy who can effectively lead in an increasingly complex operational environment.

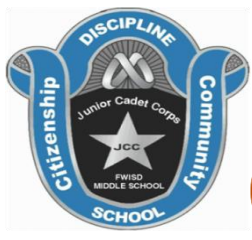

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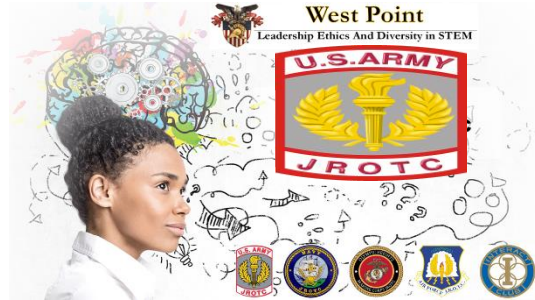

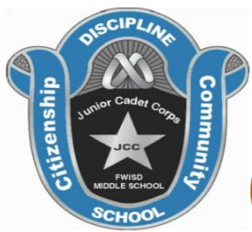

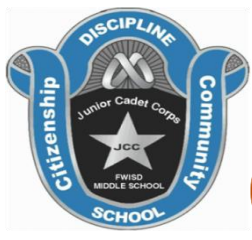

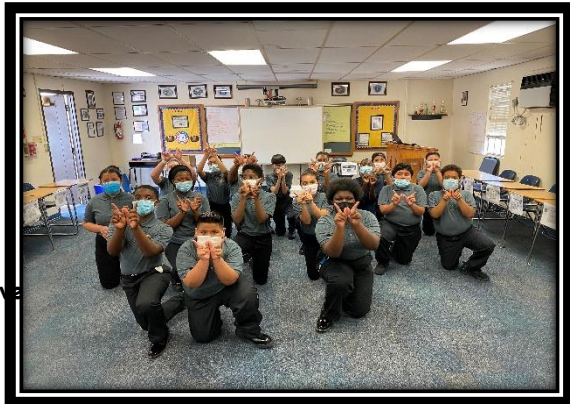
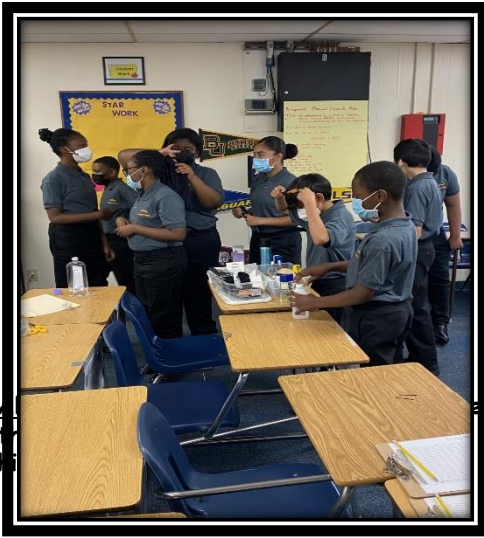

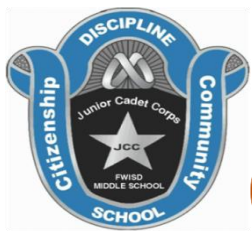

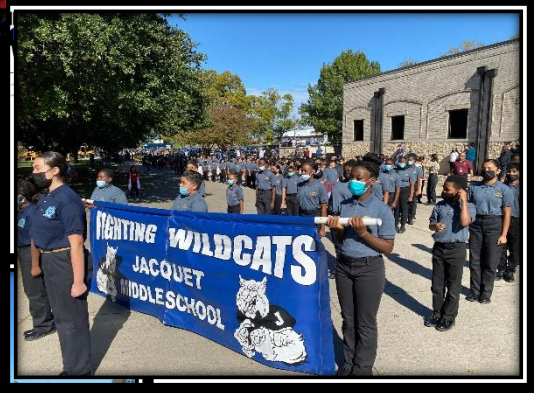
