It is hard to believe that you are reading this newsletter because it is already the end of the school year. It seems like every year goes faster and faster. Throughout the year we have had many great things going on in our schools and our district. Now as we have been going through the spring months we have been seeing or will be seeing spring concerts, field trips, spring athletic events, Prom, High School Graduation, planning for summer school, and of course, kids getting excited about summer break!

As we head into summer and reflect on the past year, I want to congratulate all of the clubs and teams on their various successes throughout the school year. I also want to congratulate the middle school staff and students on receiving an "Exceeds Expectations" rating on the school accountability report card for the second year in

a row. I would also like to congratulate the students and staff across the District for us achieving the highest rating of all of the schools in Trempealeau County and also for having the sixth highest District rating among all of the school districts within La Crosse, Trempealeau, Jackson, Monroe, and Vernon Counties. The District achieved a rating of "Meets Expectations". While we are all very proud of how we have done and how we have scored, we all know there continues to be much more to do and much more to accomplish.

As I write this newsletter, I know that it is my last as the District Administrator for the School District of Arcadia. We have been able to pay off nearly \$10 million in debt which has saved the District nearly \$2 million dollars in interest. We have developed and implemented a Continuous Improvement Plan, we have achieved the aforementioned state accountability report card ratings, we have been able to build and open the Wanek Center, we have opened a school-operated childcare center, we have redeveloped the track and field complex portion of our athletic complex, and we have become a school the WIAA has been able to rely on to host myriad tournament events. While that list is not exhaustive, it is pretty impressive. All of the aforementioned things have been accomplished because of the many wonderful people in our school district and in our communities that make up the School District of Arcadia. I want to thank everyone for their contributions.





Middle School Earned "Top Level Rating- 5 Stars" from DPI

We are thrilled to announce Arcadia Middle School has achieved an outstanding level of performance on the Wisconsin Department of Public Education Instruction Report Card.

Arcadia Middle School has been recognized with the top-level rating of "Significantly Exceeds Expectations" for the following school years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 on the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction report card state accountability system. This acknowledgment is a testament to the efforts and achievements of the students, teachers, and staff at the middle school. We recognize the hard work the elementary school has done to prepare our students for middle school as well.

As part of the state accountability system, the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) produces report cards for every publicly funded school and district in Wisconsin. These report cards include data on multiple indicators for multiple years across four Priority Areas (Achievement, Growth, Target Group Outcomes, and On-track to Graduation). A school or district's overall accountability score places the school/district into one of five overall accountability ratings:

This show is a collection of various skits from the TV series, guest stars, a few musical numbers, the opening



ARCADIA AND WINONA COTTER TEAM UP FOR LANGUAGE EXCHANGE

For the second year in a row, students learning English at Arcadia High School and students learning Spanish at Cotter High School in Winona have partnered up for an intercultural language exchange program. The idea for the partnership came from Kelly Ebbesen, former AHS English as a Second Language teacher, and current Spanish teacher at Cotter. She collaborated with AHS teachers Jacey Wozney and Kim Severson to facilitate penpal letter exchanges between students at the two schools. Arcadia students write letters in English (the language they're studying), and the Cotter students respond in Spanish (the language they're studying). "This experience provides a way to use the target language outside of the classroom in a real world, human to human interaction," said Spanish teacher Kelly Ebbesen. The program will culminate in an intercambio meeting at Arcadia High School and a meeting at Cotter High School, where the students will meet their penpals, provide tours of their schools, play games and language learning activities, and communicate in both English and Spanish. Arcadia High School teacher Kim Severson said, "Our students who had the opportunity to participate in the program last year were enthusiastic about participating again this year. They really found the program valuable." The partnership not only facilitates language acquisition in the students' target language, but it provides an opportunity for intercultural learning and friendship.

3RD GRADERS LEARN ABOUT SOUND WITH HS BAND STUDENTS HELP



On Thursday, March 28, Simon Haines and Christian Garcia Verde, both seniors and saxophone players, as well as Ben Kolstad, a junior and trumpet player, all in the AHS band, made a visit to the Elementary school to present to the third graders during their specials' time in the AES music room to perform a special concert for the students. The students were a great audience while listening to the pieces played and asked thoughtful questions regarding the boys' instruments and how the different sounds were produced on the instruments. In addition to being fun, the conference was a wonderful learning and networking opportunity for Arcadia's students, and we are already looking forward to next year's conference.


NEWCOMER STUDENT SHOWCASE AT PUBLIC LIBRARY

Last year's event was in the Wanek Center and was a success!




6th GRADE "MEGABAND"

TRACK ATHLETE RECIEVES PROSTHETIC ARM

In the spring of 2022, Caden Dahl joined the high school track and field team to run as a freshman. Caden was interested in running distance events which can include running the 4 x 800 relay. His track coach, Tim Braunschweig, and the athletic director, Wyatt Anderson, spoke with the WIAA about modifications for Caden so he didn't have to carry the baton during his leg of the relay. The WIAA rejected the modifications and denied Caden the ability to run in the relays legally. Dejected but not defeated, Caden finished the season strong, running in open events and even in some relays "illegally."

In the fall of 2022, Caden had another spinal rod surgery, sidelining him for the 2023 track season. During that time, several of his coaches started brainstorming and decided to reach out to universities to see if anyone could help design or create an attachment for Caden that would carry the baton for him. UW-Madison's mechanical engineering department was willing to take on the challenge as part of their senior capstone class. The UW-Madison team of Caroline Gillis, Jamie Wopert, Nicole Salata, and Logan Fitzpatrick accepted the challenge starting in the fall of 2023.

Throughout this school year, the team and Caden have been collaborating. They got the plans rolling through photos, videos, phone calls, and video calls. Caden and Coach Braunschwieig went to Madison in the winter for scans and molds and to try the first prototypes. They met

again this spring in Marshfield to work with Prosthetics Plus on the final product. At the beginning of April, Caden got the final product. Just in time for the 2024 track season!

Caden is now a junior at Arcadia High School and is competing this season with a custom carbon fiber attachment for his left arm, which he has already used several times! You can come to watch Caden and the rest of the team compete at the Coulee Conference Track and Field Championships, held at Arcadia High School on May 11th. Field events begin at 9:45 a.m.

Any students planning to participate in High School or Middle School athletics next year should make sure they have an up to date physical on record. Typically, physicals are done in the summer and are good for two years. If you are unsure about the

status of your physical, please contact Kay in the high school office, phone # 608-323-3315, ext. 3130 or Wyatt at ext. 3131. Please utilize the time in the summer to get your physicals, once completed give the copy to Kay in the high school office.

Schedule appointments with your primary healthcare provider as soon as possible. Appointments fill up quickly during the summer. For uninsured students, St. Clare Health Mission in La Crosse offers free sports physicals on Tuesdays and Thursdays evenings from 5-7 pm. Walk-ins only. St. Clare's Mobile Clinic will be in Arcadia on Friday, August 2nd and 16th from 9:15-11:30 a.m. in the Wanek Center parking lot. A parent must be present.



The following are the minimum required immunizations for each age and grade level according to the Wisconsin Student Immunization Law. These requirements can be waived for health, religious, or personal conviction reasons. Additional immunizations may be recommended for your child depending on his or her age. Please contact your doctor or local health department to determine if your child needs additional immunizations.

- 1. Children 5 years of age or older who are enrolled in a Pre-K class should be assessed using the immunization requirements for Kindergarten through Grade 6, which would normally correspond to the individual's age.
- 2. D = diphtheria, T = tetanus, P = pertussis vaccine. DTaP/DTP/DT/Td vaccine for all students Pre-K through 12: Four doses are required. However, if a student received the 3rd dose after the 4th birthday, further doses are not required. **Note**: A dose four days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable.
- 3. DTaP/DTP/DT vaccine for children entering Kindergarten: Each student must have received one dose after the 4th birthday (either the 3rd, 4th, or 5th dose) to be compliant. **Note**: a dose four days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable.
- 4. Tdap is an adolescent tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis combination vaccine. If a student received a dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine, such as Td, within five years before entering the grade in which Tdap is required, the student is compliant and a dose of Tdap vaccine is not required.
- 5. Polio vaccine for students entering grades Kindergarten through 12; Four doses are required. However, if a student received the 3rd dose after the 4th birthday, further doses are not required. **Note**: a dose four days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable.
- 6. Laboratory evidence of immunity to hepatitis B is also acceptable.
- 7. MMR is measles, mumps, and rubella vaccine. The first dose of MMR vaccine must have been received on or after the 1st birthday. Laboratory evidence of immunity to all three diseases (measles and mumps and rubella) is also acceptable. Note: A dose four days or less before the 1st birthday is also acceptable.
- 8. Varicella vaccine is chickenpox vaccine. Students with a reliable history of varicella disease are not required to receive the Varicella vaccine. A parent or guardian may indicate that their student has had chickenpox on the Student Immunization Record form (F-04020L).



- 2. Vacuna contra la D= difteria, T= tétanos, P= tos ferina. Vacuna contra la DTaP/DTP/Td para todos los estudiantes desde el prekínder hasta el 12.º grado, se requieren cuatro dosis. Sin embargo, si un estudiante recibió la 3.ª dosis después de cumplir los 4 años, no se requieren más dosis. **Nota**: También es aceptable una dosis cuatro días o menos antes de cumplir los 4 años.
- 3. Vacuna contra la DTaP/DTP/DT para los niños que ingresan a kínder: cada estudiante debe haber recibido una dosis después de cumplir los 4 años (ya sea la 3.ª, 4.º o 5.º dosis) para cumplir con los requisitos. **Nota**: También es aceptable una dosis cuatro días o menos antes de cumplir los 4 años.
- 4. La Tdap es una vacuna contra el tétanos, la difteria y la tos ferina acelular para adolescentes. Si un estudiante recibió una dosis de una vacuna que contiene tétanos, como la Td, en un plazo de cinco años antes de entrar al grado en el que se requiere la Tdap, el estudiante cumple con los requisitos y no se requiere una dosis de la vacuna contra la Tdap.
- 5. Vacuna contra la polio para los estudiantes que ingresan a kínder hasta el 12.º grado: se requieren cuatro dosis. Sin embargo, si un estudiante recibió la 3.ª dosis después de cumplir los 4 años, no se requieren más dosis. **Nota**: También es aceptable una dosis cuatro días o menos antes de cumplir los 4 años.
- 6. También es aceptable la evidencia de laboratorio de inmunidad a la hepatitis B.
- 7. La MMR es una vacuna contra el sarampión, las paperas y la rubéola. La primera dosis de la vacuna MMR debe recibirse al año de vida o antes. También es aceptable la evidencia de laboratorio de inmunidad a las tres enfermedades (sarampión, paperas y rubéola). **Nota**: También es aceptable una dosis cuatro días o menos antes de cumplir el primer año.
- 8. La vacuna contra la varicela. No es necesario que los estudiantes que tengan un historial confiable de la enfermedad de la varicela reciban la vacuna contra la varicela. Un padre o tutor puede indicar que el menor ha tenido varicela en el formulario de Student Immunization Record (expediente de vacunación del estudiante) (F-04020L).
