Daycare and Preschool Providers Earn Early Literacy Certification


As part of San Benito County Office of Education's Building Bridges to Literacy Initiative, 18 daycare providers and preschool teachers earned their Early Literacy Certificates on April 13, 2024. The Early Literacy Certification Program is the first of its kind in San Benito County, bringing early literacy classes to daycare providers and preschool teachers throughout San Benito County. It is designed to help participants learn new skills and strategies around reading and literacy with the goal of supporting educators as they work with our youngest children to develop critical literacy skills.

Dr. Danielle Thomas led the Early Literacy training, which consisted of a series of workshops covering six components of literacy and five areas of reading necessary to help young children learn. As part of the requirements to receive their certification, participants created an Early Literacy Plan that they implemented with the children in their care. Dr. Thomas and SBCOE's Educational Services Department staff will continue to support the recipients as they put the strategies they learned in place.

On April 25th, educators from across San Benito County attended the final workshop in the SBCOE's Social Emotional Learning Community of Practice (SEL CoP) series. Participants were warmly welcomed to the SBCOE Alternative Education campus, where Mental Health Coordinator, Adina Austin showcased the student wellness center. The SBCOE Alternative Education Wellness Center serves as a model for San Benito County as well as regionally. Participants were provided manicures by Alternative Education students and made do-it-yourself diffuser sprays from a variety of options. Participants were also greeted with an extensive charcuterie selection, citrus water station and student fidget tools to take back to their classrooms. These intentional calming components represented the Self-Care portion of the workshop's focus- "The Superpowers of Sleep, Stress & Self-Care", presented by Dr. Matthew Rensi, LPCC. The keynote speaker, Kevon Lee, shared inspiring insights on his experience growing up as a foster and homeless student and how creating supportive environments for students can lead them to success. SBCOE Summer Programs Begin in June

San Benito County Office of Education's Early Childhood Special Education Center will offer ESY (Extended School Year) to students who have an IEP June 11, 2024 to July 11, 2024 for a total of 20 instructional days. Students qualify for ESY if the team feels that regression towards goals will happen over an extended break. This year, ESY will focus on peer interactions, pre-academics, and following a picture schedule with daily routines. In addition, teachers often incorporate a few fun-filled water days for our students when the weather is warm! Students also have access to additional services in their IEP such as Speech and/or Occupational Therapy, if applicable. SBCOE's Low Incidence Team (DHH, VI, O&M, OI) will support Hollister High School and the Hollister School District students during their respective summer schools.

Summer School is also available to SBCOE students enrolled in Santa Ana Opportunity School and San Andreas Continuation School so they can earn additional credits toward graduation. The Summer School program is one way SBCOE helps students who have struggled academically make up the learning they lost so they can graduate ready to enter the workforce or continue their education. Summer School runs June 7-28.

Student Artwork Honoring Cesar Chavez Recognized

Earlier this spring, students at Pinnacles Community, San Andreas Continuation, and Santa Ana Opportunity School honored Cesar Chavez's contributions to the rights of migrant farmworkers through art and writing. These students were recognized on April 23, 2024 by Sylvia Chavez Delgado, daughter of Cesar Chavez, and Mickie Luna, president of the Latino Coalition of San Benito County. The recognition not only acknowledged the students' creativity but also their connection to the struggles and stories within their own families.

The student art contest organized by the Latino Coalition earlier this year provided a platform for these young individuals to express themselves and share their unique narratives. The works were also displayed at the SBCOE Arts Showcase in April. Their works serve as a source of pride for students, many of whom come from migrant families, themselves. The recognition affirms the value of their experiences and contributions and was especially meaningful because it occurred on the anniversary of Cesar Chavez's passing, adding a deeper layer of significance to the event.



San Benito County Educators Complete “Learning How English Works” Series

San Benito County Office of Education, in partnership with Loyola Marymount University, culminated the last and 5th Student Work Analysis Protocol (SWAP) session on April 17, 2024. As part of the year-long professional learning in English Language Development (ELD), educators across the county were provided with foundational knowledge of ELD and utilized Learning How English Works (LHEW) to unpack and implement ELD standards. Teachers used strategies they learned with their students and had the opportunity to collaborate on how to help students improve their English and writing skills. SBCOE hopes to offer the series again next year.
