SBCOE Hosts First Literacy Summit in County

San Benito County Office of Education hosted the county's first Literacy Summit on January 25 at the Veteran's Memorial Building in downtown Hollister. SBCOE Director of Curriculum & Instruction and Equity & Access, Mai Cruz, coordinated the event, which featured nationally renowned speaker and educator, Dr. Kate Kinsella. The event brought together parents, educators and community members to learn how they can support literacy for students throughout San Benito County.

SBCOE is actively working to improve literacy in the county through its Building Bridges2Literacy Initiative. Literacy Summit attendees heard from keynote speaker, Dr. Kate Kinsella and participated in Roundtable Discussions led by local educational leaders and partners including Hollister Elementary School District, Navigator Schools, North County Joint Union School District, San Benito High School District, Footstep2Brilliance, Scholastic. Roundtable discussions focused on how to support literacy for students at all grade levels as well as for multi-lingual learners and struggling readers. SBCOE Boosts Cybersecurity

The San Benito County Office of Education has recently taken a significant step towards enhancing its cybersecurity posture by implementing Duo's multi-factor authentication (MFA) solution. In an era where cyber threats are becoming increasingly sophisticated, the adoption of MFA is a critical strategy for protecting sensitive data. This technology requires users to verify their identity using multiple pieces of evidence before gaining access to digital resources, significantly reducing the likelihood of unauthorized access.

This initiative reflects the growing recognition of the importance of robust cybersecurity measures within the educational sector. By deploying Duo's MFA, the San Benito County Office of Education not only safeguards its digital assets and the personal information of students and staff but also sets a precedent for other institutions in the importance of prioritizing digital security. This proactive approach is essential in combating the rising tide of cyber threats facing educational institutions today.

SBCOE Hosts Budget Workshop

School District and Community Board members from around the area came together for Capitol Advisor's Budget Perspectives Workshop in January. SBCOE hosted the event, which gave attendees insight and information about the recently released Governor's Budget Proposal for the 2024-25 fiscal year. The current proposal provides funding for most of the TK-12 grade education programs with a small COLA (Cost of Living very Adjustment) of 0.76%. The Governor will make adjustments to his proposal over the next several months before bringing it back in May. The legislature will then pass a budget over the summer.

Student's Qualify for CA State Spelling Bee

The San Benito County Office of Education held its Countywide Spelling Bee on February 6, 2024, at the Veteran's Memorial Building in downtown Hollister. Twenty students qualified for the event in two age groups. Students in grades 4-6 competed in the elementary division while 7th-9th grade students were eligible for the middle school division. After more than 15 rounds in each division, the top three spellers were finally selected, a testament to the strength of the competition this year. The top two spellers in each division qualified for the California State Spelling Bee hosted by the San Joaquin County Office of Education in Stockton, California on April 27, 2024 at the Wentworth Education Center. Ms. **Austin** has spearheaded the development and implementation of wellness centers and calming corners in SBCOE Alternative Education Programs, Tres Pinos School and Hollister Navigator School and is working with Willow Grove and Bitterwater Schools to develop wellness areas.

SBCOE Begins Early Literacy Certification Program

As part of its Building Bridges2Literacy Initiative, the San Benito County Office of Education began a new Early Literacy Certification Program on February 3, 2024. The program brings early literacy classes to daycare providers and preschool teachers throughout San Benito County and is designed to help participants learn new skills and strategies they can use with our youngest children to develop critical literacy skills. Eighteen participants attended the first in a series of workshops that run through April 13, 2024.

Led by led by Dr. Danielle Thomas, the workshop series will cover six components of literacy and five areas of reading necessary to help young children learn. Participants received four children's books, as well as a set of Alphabet paired cards that were incorporated into the training. As part of the certification, participants will create an Early Literacy Plan that they will implement with the children they work with currently.

Students Continue to Build Their Literacy Skills

In January, County Superintendent Krystal Lomanto visited classrooms to award top Fall Reading Challenge winners at local schools. Students in the top three classrooms as well as those who read 25,000 or more words using the Footsteps2Brilliance reading app received reading charms. Students in Ms. Burbank's Kindergarten class at Rancho Santana, Ms. Allemand's 1st grade class at Rancho Santana, and Ms. Fuentes' 1st grade class at San Juan Elementary School received star reading charms while students in the county who read over 25,000 words were awarded trophy charms.

This year, SBCOE also held a winter reading challenge between December 1 and January 5. The top 15 readers were recognized at the San Benito County Office of Education Literacy Summit on January 26.

San Benito County Mental Health Coordination Results in Universal Referral Process

School-based mental health services in San Benito County took a big step forward in January as schools and community agencies completed the San Benito County Universal Referral Process. This new process will streamline services for students while also ensuring they receive the appropriate Mental health services. Because the same system will be used to coordinate services in all public schools and community agencies that serve school-aged children, the process will also be easier for families to understand.

The universal referral process is the product of two collaborative networks led by the San Benito County Office of Education and the San Benito County Behavioral Health Department. The Mental Health Lead Network consists of leaders from each agency and county districts who come together to develop common processes and practices to support the mental health needs of students in San Benito County. Monthly San Benito County Mental Health Provider Network meetings are available to all mental health providers in the county. The goal of the network is for providers to learn more about what each agency offers and to collaborate on processes and procedures.

In addition to the Universal Referral Process, the two teams have also created a Universal Referral Form to be used by each school and have agreed upon common language and understandings around Tier 1, (general), Tier 2 (intervention) and Tier 3 (intensive) services.
