School Social Worker Week March 3-9



School social workers across the nation are celebrated the first week of March each year. The week is used to acknowledge their work in helping students achieve academic success. Although social work in schools has been highlighted in recent years due to the increase in school=based mental health services, social work in schools actually began over 110 years ago by visiting teachers. School social workers work with teachers, parents, and school staff to help students deal with mental health and behavioral challenges and provide academic and classroom support. They also help develop education policies, work with crisis interventions, and identify and report child neglect and abuse.

For the past four years, SBCOE has hired School Social Workers to serve in 17 schools throughout San Benito County, This is part of SBCOE's Healthy Minds, Healthy Lives initiative and provides needed mental health services to students.

Students in the Pinnacles Community School morning session began taking a Culinary Class taught by Kneaded Culinary Academy in February. The class has been a huge success and we are looking forward to offering the same program to our afternoon class in March.

As part of our science curriculum, students and Santa Ana Opportunity School and San Andreas Continuation School will be participating in this year's STEAM Expo. Completing a science fair project provides students with valuable understanding of the scientific method. Students are encouraged to design their own experiments to spark their interest in science.

As the school year enters the final few months, Senior students have been preparing for life after high school. All seniors completed an application to Gavilan College in February. Every senior will also be complete their FAFSA in March. Additionally, Senior students will be participating in Mock Interviews with Community Solutions.

ECE Update

The San Benito County Office of Education Special Education Departed facilitated a Parent Matriculation Meeting at the Early Childhood Special Education Center to inform parents about the transition process from Preschool to Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten. Neighboring school district Special Education Directors attended the meeting and spoke about each of their district's processes. In attendance were Michelle Croucher from Aromas San Juan Unified School District, Gabe Gutierrez from the Hollister School District, and Kristi Vieyra from North County Joint Union School District.

The purpose of the Parent Matriculation Meetings is to provide and share information from the SBCOE Preschool program to the DOR (District of Residence). This collaboration across entities with families helps ensure students are set up for success as they move from Preschool to Transitional Kindergarten or Kindergarten.
