Early College High Schools (ECHS) are innovative high schools that allow students least likely to attend college an opportunity to earn a high school diploma and 60 college credit hours. The goal of the Collegiate Academy at Oscar Dean Wyatt High School is for students to graduate with 45-60 hours of transferable college credit. Students have the potential to earn a two-year associate degree along with their high school diploma – tuition free – saving families thousands of dollars in college costs.

Although many high schools around the nation offer concurrent and dual-enrollment opportunities, they traditionally serve the highest achieving students of their class. Collegiate Academies will target all students entering the ninth grade.
