Grading and GPA

Weighted GPA

The district categorizes and weights courses as Tier I, II and Tier III. Tier I courses include Advanced Placement (AP) courses, dual credit and UT OnRamps dual enrollment courses and other rigorous district designated courses, Tier II includes pre-AP or honors courses and Tier III courses include all other courses offered not designated as Tier I or II. Please see the FWISD Guide to Grade Reporting for the most updated changes to class ranking.

Unweighted GPA

The district also calculates an unweighted GPA using a simple whole number scale.

FWISD has an open enrollment policy for Advanced Placement (AP), pre-AP and honors courses. Students in dual credit through TCC put sit for the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) exam and reach a qualifying score in order to participate in academic classes. UT OnRamps course are dual enrollment courses that student can elect to take and do not have TSI requirements.
