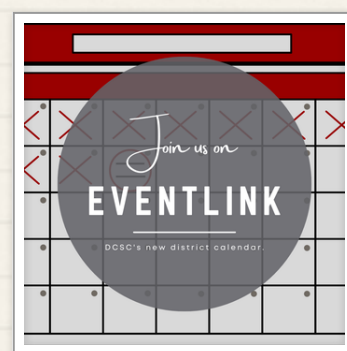

Eventlink

During the 2023-2024 school year, we will be utilizing Eventlink as our district calendar. Eventlink is a subscription-based calendar that allows our students, staff, parents and community members to keep track of the events that matter most to you. Several of you may already have an account if your student plays sports for DCSC, but we are now using it for ALL DCSC events.



We have three accounts available:

- Danville Elementary Schools
- Danville Middle School
- Danville Community High School

Within those calendars are different groups that you can opt to receive notifications for, including school-specific events, sporting events, performances, clubs and so much more! It is up to you which events you want to stay the most up-to-date on.

As we make this switch, we recommend that everyone visits our website to learn how to create an account before the start of the school year. We also have instructions available for those who already have an account, but are unsure how to subscribe to new calendars. We hope this transition is beneficial for everyone involved! We know keeping up with every event can be a challenge, and it is our goal to make it easier for everyone.

ParentSquare Notification Settings

Have you customized your notification settings in ParentSquare? You can control your notifications in the ParentSquare app or when you log in to www.Parentsquare.com and click on My Account in the upper right hand corner. (This is the same for families and for staff)

This is a great feature for anyone who has a preference on how they receive information (text v. email, app notifications, instant or digest notifications, etc.). It is also extremely important to make sure your contact information is accurate and up-to-date!



Be Sure to Download Stopfinder

If your student is a district resident and not in a walk zone, please download the Stopfinder App on your phone. You should have received an email with a link to activate Stopfinder. If you didn't see it, please check your Spam folder.



Once you have access, you will be able to see all of your student's bus information. If you have any problems with the link, please email the transportation office at danvilletransportation@danville.k12.in.us and we will address that issue. For further questions, please contact the transportation office at 317-745-6875.

Beginning in January 2024, we will be using Stopfinder to communicate all bus information, including cancelations. After that time, we will no longer use ParentSquare to alert parents for bus delays, cancelations or route changes. **It is vital that all parents with bus riders download this app.**

Celebrating High Achievement

We recognized excellent testing at our most recent Board of School Trustees meeting! Danville Community High School offered five AP classes and ran two AP clubs during the 2022-2023 school year. We had 167 students enrolled in the AP programs, and 180 exams were

taken in May, with an overall passing rate of 60%. Of the 167 students who took exams, 13 students received the highest score of 5 on one or more of their exams. 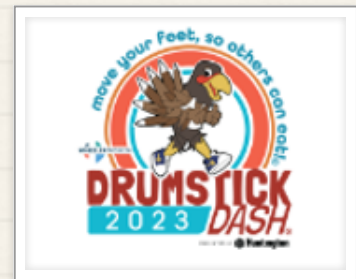

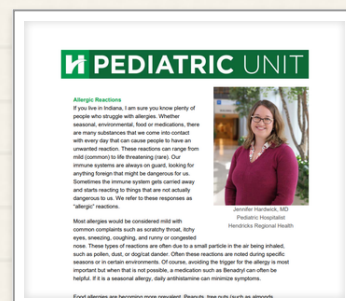

All DCSC schools will be utilizing an eLearning Day granted by the Department of Education on Monday, October 23, 2023, to engage our staff in a day of Professional Development. Students do not have to report to school, but they will have work to complete online.

Assignments should be posted by 9 a.m. in Schoology. On eLearning BASIC days, any student who has not attempted to complete their work by the beginning of the next school day will be marked absent. If there are extenuating circumstances (no Internet at home, Internet outage, broken device, etc.) that prevent your child from completing their work on eLearning Days, please communicate that clearly with their teacher so they may be given up to five days to complete the work. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any additional questions.

All school offices and the Administration Office will be open at their normally scheduled time.

2023-2024 School Calendar

Wondering about our 2023-2024 school dates? Here you go!

This year we have four days blocked off for Professional Development Days, which will come in the form of eLearning or waiver days. The eLearning days will be eLearning BASIC days where students can complete their assigned work at their own pace, and teachers will have office hours available. Waiver days are no-work days for students. Teachers will be in all day, but they will not prepare any material for students.

The eLearning/Waiver days are as follows:

- October 23 - eLearning BASIC
- January 25 - Waiver
- March 1 - Waiver
- April 8 - TBD

The last day will be determined based on how many waiver days and/or eLearning days we have left. We are only allotted a certain amount each year in order to fulfill the 180 school day requirements.

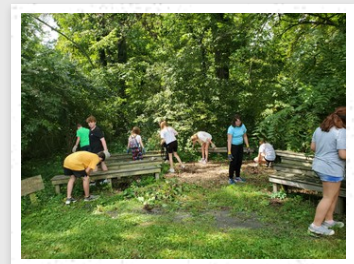
NORTH



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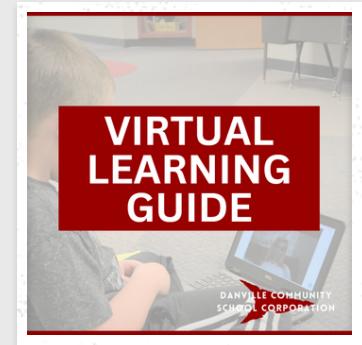


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VIRTUAL LEARNING GUIDE

As you know, we have four Professional Development Days planned for the school year on top of any that we may put in place due to weather or other unforeseen incidents. These days can create some confusion as to what is expected from teachers, students and other staff, and we want to draw your attention to [this page](#) on our website to learn more about the policies we have in place. We have also outlined specific parts below.



Professional Development Days (Scheduled eLearning Days):

Some of these scheduled dates will be eLearning BASIC Days. Teachers will be engaged in professional development but will have time built into their schedules to answer any questions. The best way to get a hold of teachers will be by email, and they will respond as quickly as possible during their next break in training. On an eLearning BASIC Day, there should be a limited amount of student-to-teacher virtual engagement. Assignments will be due when students return to school the next day. If a child is unable to complete work in this timeframe for any reason, they should reach out to their teacher and complete work as soon as possible when they return in person. Students who do not complete the assignments and do not make contact with a teacher will be marked as absent for the period or day.

Some of these scheduled dates may also come in the form of a Waiver of Instruction Day. On these days, students will not have any work to complete at home and are not expected to log on at all during the day.

The Little Warrior Learning Center Preschool and our PACE program will remain open for the entire day. All school offices and the Administration Office will be open.

Our upcoming Professional Development Days: October 23, January 25, March 1, April 8.

Weather eLearning Days

District alerts and/or communications will indicate between BASIC and LIVE instruction during an eLearning closure. We will also include information about PACE and LWLC in that communication. Here are the differences between the two types of eLearning Days:

eLearning BASIC Day - These days will provide our students with virtual instruction like on scheduled eLearning Days. Teachers will be available throughout the day to answer questions, and assignments will be posted in Schoology for students to complete. On an eLearning BASIC Day, there should be a limited amount of student-to-teacher virtual engagement.

eLearning LIVE Day - These days will provide our students with live person-to-person virtual instruction that follows their normal school day schedule with a high amount of teacher engagement with students. At the secondary level, students will follow their synchronous bell

schedule. At the elementary level, homeroom teachers should help guide students on a schedule similar to what they follow when they are in-person.

On eLearning LIVE Days, teachers are not expected to provide direct instruction for the entire duration of their class. They may teach a lesson, give the students some downtime, and come back to start the next lesson. They may also give students time to complete an assignment and answer any questions that may arise. During class time beyond direct instruction, teachers will remain on call and host office hours. Teachers are not expected to respond to questions outside of their normally scheduled hours.

All learning activities should be posted to Schoology by 9 a.m. on the morning of the eLearning Day. Assignments will be due when students return to school. If a child is unable to complete work in this timeframe for any reason, they should reach out to their teacher and complete work as soon as possible when they return in person. Students who do not complete the assignments and do not make contact with a teacher will be marked as absent for the period or day.

Helping Your Child Deal with Grief Around Illness and Death

Someone important to your child will likely become sick or die before they reach adulthood. Death can be scary, and, unless discussed proactively, friends or others may tell your child stories about death that may not be true. Dealing with this in mind, it helps to talk with your child about death before (or during) their experience adjusting to that loss.

Stories in books, movies, television shows, or the death of a pet can all be ways to broach the subject with your child, discussing what it means. We suggest discussing it in ways that they will understand, which will vary based on their age and development over time.

It is important to remember that your child will consider you a role model for how they should grieve and that it's okay to express your grief in front of them. It's important to help your child feel safe and comfortable, providing a safe space to express themselves.

How should I act around my child?

It's important not to withdraw or seek separation from your children in moments of personal grief. We suggest extra physical attention to comfort your child and enhance their sense of security. Maintaining family routines will also help. Let your child know that it's okay to feel sad, to talk about it, and to remember those who died.

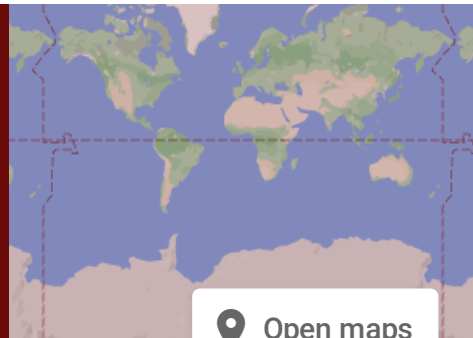

2nd Grade Moving to South Elementary in 2024-2025

Currently, South Elementary is undergoing construction for several big changes, including the addition of 14 brand-new classrooms. The idea behind this was to create more space for our students to grow and learn, which is becoming especially important as we begin to reach capacity at North Elementary. In fact, it will provide us enough space to move a whole grade level over to South Elementary.



Starting in the 2024-2025 school year, we plan to have our 2nd-grade students join their peers in 3rd and 4th grade at South Elementary. This means that our current 1st-grade students will move to South Elementary to begin their 2nd-grade year in the fall of 2024. Our new structure will be as follows:

Delays and Cancelations

Health and Safety During the Holidays

The holidays are an exciting time of year. Unfortunately, it is also a time when accidents and injuries tend to increase. From late November to mid-January, when families gather, parties are scheduled and travel spikes, safety should be top of mind. Here are some tips to ensure your family remains safe and injury-free throughout the season.

Stay Up to Date with COVID-19 Vaccines
 According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, children and adults should stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines. Another booster is available for the 2023-2024 season. Three pharmaceutical companies are offering this year's booster, and none are preferred over the others. Anyone 6 months or older should get at least 1 dose, although there are certain instances when more than one may be necessary. Of course, anyone who has symptoms of illness should stay home. When gathering with people from multiple households, consider taking a COVID-19 test before the event to further reduce risk.

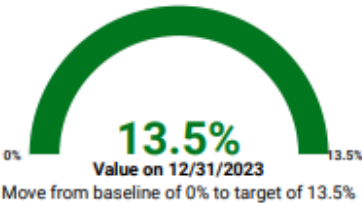

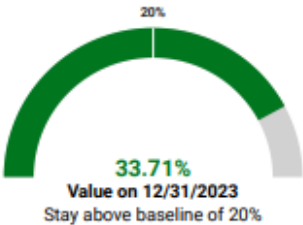

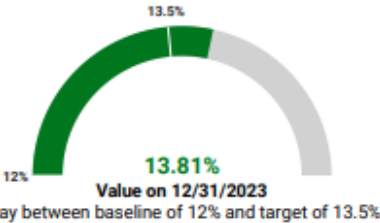

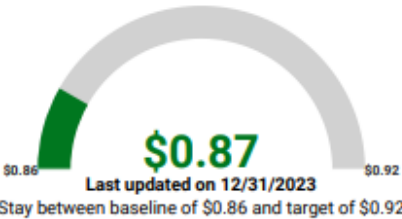

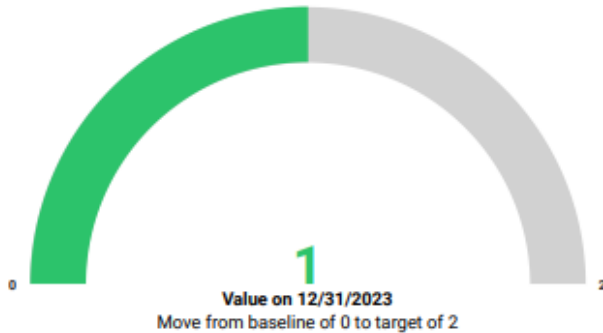

Delays and Cancellations

As we enter the winter season, ensuring the safety of our students remains our top priority at Danville Community Schools. The decision to delay or cancel school due to adverse weather conditions is a responsibility that we take very seriously, as it impacts the entire school community.



In cases of fog, ice, or snow affecting travel conditions, we may opt for a delay to allow for improved visibility, salted roads, or plowed snow. If conditions do not improve within two hours, we may proceed with school cancellation or implement an eLearning Day.

The well-being of our students during bus wait times is also a crucial factor. Wind chill is closely monitored, utilizing information from the National Weather Service, which details wind speed, temperature, and frostbite exposure times.

Our aim is to make timely decisions by 5:30 a.m., communicated promptly by our Communications Coordinator, Mrs. Abby England. Please ensure your contact information is current on ParentSquare for timely alerts via text, email, and app notifications.

2nd Grade Moving to South Elementary in 2024-2025

Currently, South Elementary is undergoing construction for several big changes, including the addition of 14 brand-new classrooms. The idea behind this was to create more space for our students to grow and learn, which is becoming especially important as we begin to reach capacity at North Elementary. In fact, it will provide us enough space to move a whole grade level over to South Elementary.

Starting in the 2024-2025 school year, we plan to have our 2nd-grade students join their peers in 3rd and 4th grade at South Elementary. This means that our current 1st-grade students will move to South Elementary to begin their 2nd-grade year in the fall of 2024. Our new structure will be as follows:

- Little Warriors, kindergarten and 1st grade will be at North Elementary,
- 2nd grade, 3rd grade and 4th grade will be at South Elementary,
- 5th grade, 6th grade, 7th grade and 8th grade will be at Danville Community Middle School,
- And, finally, 9th grade, 10th grade, 11th grade and 12th grade will be at Danville Community High School.

We are committed to making this transition as seamless as possible. We will still follow our same goal for students to attend the same school as their grade-level classmates, regardless of where

they live.

We hope this update comes as good news, and we look forward to beginning this transition next fall!

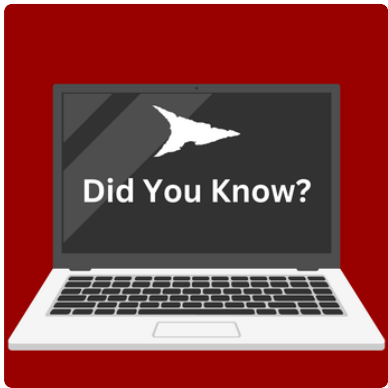

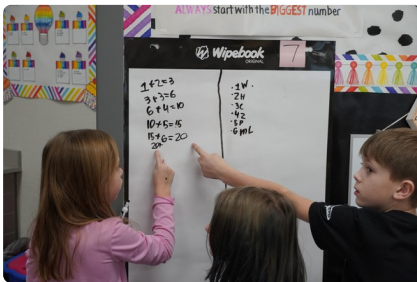

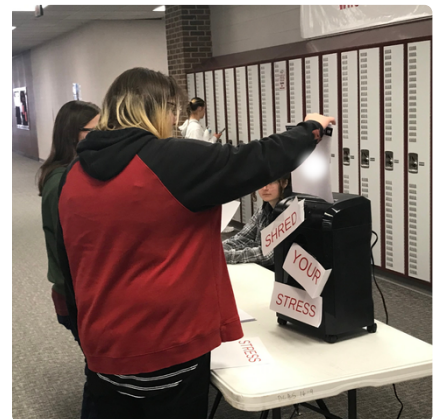
North

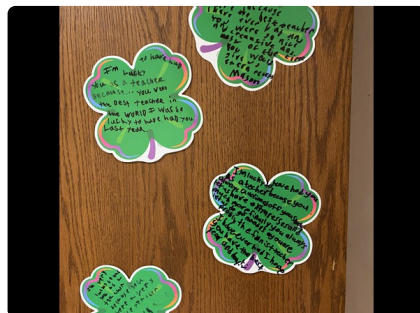

•A Message from Your Assistant Superintendent for Instruction•

Springtime brings warmer weather, flowers, hummingbirds, and lots of state assessments around our school buildings! :-)

Our second and third-grade students recently took the IREAD-3 assessment, a foundational reading skills test measuring comprehension, vocabulary, and phonics. We were thrilled with their performance and appreciate the effort each student put in! In addition, students at the high school recently participated in the SAT Test. This test is utilized as one measure for college acceptance, but in Indiana, it is also a graduation qualifying exam and one way to fulfill the needed requirements to graduate. While we haven't received the school-wide results for this test yet, we know that our high school staff have been working hard to prepare students for the rigor that is seen on this assessment each year! Coming up once we return from break is the ILEARN assessment. Students in grades 3-8 will take this school accountability test in multiple testing sessions in math, English language arts, science (grades 4 & 6), and social studies (grade 5). Students will take the Biology ILEARN assessment once they've taken the course. Next year, we will pilot a new through-year ILEARN assessment, which will give us specific data on performance at checkpoints throughout the year, helping our staff intervene earlier in the year. Students with significant cognitive abilities in grades 3-8 and Biology will return from break and take the I AM assessment. In addition to required state assessments, students in Advanced Placement courses will sit for their tests in the spring, and secondary students will take final exams at the end of the year. The assessments we administer provide evidence to help us make informed decisions. We use a variety of data points in addition to these state assessments to paint a full picture of the strengths and areas of challenge for each student. Assessments help our teachers understand which teaching approaches are most effective, define the next steps for student growth, develop lesson plans, and group students for specific learning needs. We thank you for your support of these measures!

High Ability Identification

The Indiana Department of Education requires school districts to identify and serve High Ability students in grades K-12. The High Ability Identification Team for this district uses a well-designed process, consistent with Indiana Code and Rules, based upon sound measures designed for use with High Ability learners in order to find those students whose academic needs are far beyond those of typical students of the same age in our district. In this process, students are identified for services through multiple pathways including ability and/or achievement in Language Arts and/or Mathematics.

If a child is recommended for High Ability services, his or her parents will receive notification from

the district via email and/or mailed letter. An appeal process is in place in the event the identification team does not place a child in services and a teacher, parent or another person close to the child challenges the decision. An official written appeal using this form must be filled out on or before the appeal date below.

Please visit our website at <https://www.danville.k12.in.us/departments/special-services/high-ability-program> for a thorough explanation of the identification process and a copy of an appeal form.

For this year, the notification date is: Friday, June 7th
The date for the filing of this appeal is: Friday, June 21st

Please note that while we must formally identify students based on specific state criteria, we know that there are many advanced learners in our classrooms who may not be flagged to the state. Our staff will continue to differentiate in the classroom in order to best meet the needs of each and every student to provide appropriately scaffolded instruction. 
