

#### **Overview of NYSSB**






- 36 states offer a Seal of Biliteracy to high school graduates
- Fox Lane High School first offered NYSSB in 2016-17
- One of 53 high schools in the Hudson Valley offering NYSSB this year
- 17% of NYS high schools offer the NYSSB

#### Benefits to Multilingualism



- Post-secondary studies
- Linguistically diverse students
- Global citizenship
- Marketability



- o 56% say their foreign language demand will increase in the next 5 years.
- 47% state a need for language skills exclusively for the domestic market.
- 1 in 4 U.S. employers lost business due to a lack of language skills.




### **NYS Seal of Biliteracy**

• Score of 80+ on NYS Regents Exam in ELA

- Commanding or expanding level of proficiency on NYSESLAT
- Average of 85+ in all 11th and 12th grade ELA courses

Score of 3+ on AP English Language or Literature exam









- Final score of 85+ in a Level IV,
  V, or AP World Language course
- Score of 4+ on AP Language or Literature exam in a World Language





### Oral component (4 points total)

#### Oral presentation in target language

- Five-minute presentation of an issue that has a significant impact on humanity
- Topic may have impact at the global or local level
- Presentation should make explicit connection to bilingualism, biliteracy, and/or multiculturalism
- Use of wordless visual is allowed but not required
- Panel will ask follow-up questions to continue discussion

#### Interview

- Panel will ask questions in both languages
- Candidate will respond to questions about personal experiences related to language and culture
