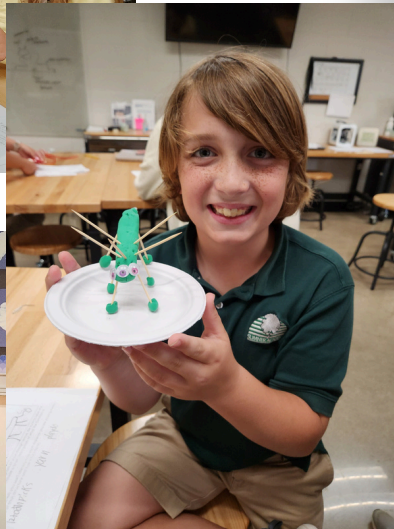


HUB happenings

Students were assigned one of four unique and distant planets where they had to come up with their own plant or animal that could live there. The environmental conditions, including temperature, force of gravity, and availability of resources all had to be considered when making sure their organism was properly adapted to the planet. From the “world of eternal darkness,” to a planet composed entirely of lava seas, students had to combine ingenuity, scientific understanding, and creativity to complete the task. At the end, third and fourth-grade students presented their plants and animals together.

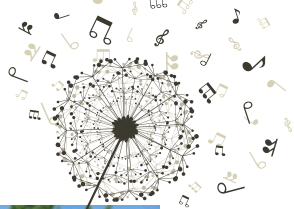
