*Some new additions to our school are, a new couch to our commons to make students more comfortable and tables upstairs for students who like to eat on the balcony.*

*We sold 290 tickets to prom which is a really great turnout for us. The theme was Enchanted Garden and the venue, Victorian Vineyard, which is owned by a Hockinson Family. ASB planned decorations such as balloon arch, centerpieces, and small details to make the experience great! We received a lot of compliments on the DJ, italian sodas, and photobooth. Mrs. Birkinbine donated a flower arch and a flower background for the photobooth. We also had 15 chaperones which is huge for us.*
