


Superintendent's Bulletin

Dear RCSD Community Member,

On Tuesday, May 21, the Rye Community came out to demonstrate its support by voting in favor of the 2024-2025 school district budget. With a 71.6% percent approval rating, we were higher than our peer districts. I am hopeful that this is reflective of community satisfaction with the educational program. We saw a slightly higher turnout than in years past, with 1,352 votes cast, versus 850 last year, and 1,052 in 2022.

There were three candidates for three Board of Education seats, making for an uncontested election. Callie Erickson, who is completing her second term on the Board, was reelected, and Valerie Lapham and Matt Schibanoff earned seats on the Board. Board member Kelsey Johnson did not
