S&P Global Ratings raised its long-term and underlying rating on Mount Pleasant CSD's general obligation debt up one notch to AA+ and reaffirmed its outlook as stable. This reflects a combination of incremental reduction of debt, stable maintenance of healthy reserve levels to protect the short and longterm financial health of the District, the District's history of strong budgetary performance and the strong local economy.
