- [Arvada Community Food Bank](#): Provides food pantry assistance to local families 12 times per year. Must live in their service area to qualify. Also provides educational programming, GED assistance, and emergency food assistance.



- [Children's Advisory Network](#): Provides year round private in-home or in-school [speech and language therapies and screenings in schools](#) to catch any vision, hearing or speech issues that a child may have.



- [Child Care Assistance Program \(CCAP\)](#): Provides financial assistance to eligible, low-income families who need child care benefits for children from birth to age 12 or children with additional care needs under the age of 19.



- [Developmental Disabilities Resource Center \(DDRC\)](#): Provides resources and person-centered service coordination for children and adults with developmental

disabilities in Jefferson, Clear Creek, Gilpin and Summit counties in Colorado. Also provides a full range of in-home supports, independent and supported home settings, and vocational and employment services to children, adults, and adults with developmental disabilities.
