VOTE ON OR BEFORE JUNE 18

Dear Community,

Residents of Barre City and Barre Town can vote on or before June 18, 2024. The ballot will ask voters to approve a budget of \$57,686,445, resulting in an education spending of \$11,273 per pupil. The budget includes grant funds and represents a 9.21% increase to the general fund. Our education spending has increased by 5.31%, lower than the state-wide average of 11.2%. The district tax rate is \$1.10, below the state average of \$1.33.

Due to the Common Level of Appraisal (CLA), adjusted tax rates for Barre City and Barre Town are \$1.44 and \$1.27 respectively, both lower than the state average. Tax rate increases for Barre City and Barre Town are 3% and 5% respectively, significantly lower than the state average of 17%. WHAT CONTRIBUTED TO THE \$4.5 MILLION INCREASE TO THE FY25 BUDGET?

The FY25 budget represents a 9.21% increase to the general fund, or \$4,570,811 higher than the FY24 budget. Many factors contributed to that increase, most of which are outside of the district's control. Again, our education spending is going up 5.31% with our proposed budget.
