A Few Important Notes on Summer Reading

- All students are required to read <u>at least one</u> book from this year's summer reading list.
- Books required for AP classes <u>do not count</u> towards summer reading.
- You may choose <u>any</u> book from the list; it does not need to be selected by one of your teachers.
- Some books on this list may have appeared on a previous summer reading list, and some may have been made into TV shows and movies. You're welcome to watch the adaptations of the book (compare and discuss with friends!), but <u>you must also read the book</u>.
- You must choose a book that you have not already used for a summer reading assignment.
- English teachers will assess your knowledge of the book in the fall.
