As we enter the season of Arizona State Assessments for our students' in grades 3 through 8, as well as, 9 and 11, it is essential to recognize that while these assessments provide valuable insight into academic progress, they do not encompass the full spectrum of our student's potential or worth.

In the Cave Creek Unified School District (CCUSD), we are committed to fostering well-rounded individuals who excel not only academically, but also socially, emotionally, and creatively. We believe that a holistic approach to education is key to preparing students for success in all facets of life in the future of their choosing.

While we encourage our students to do their best on these assessments, we also emphasize the importance of maintaining balance and prioritizing their overall well-being by providing support and encouragement that can help them feel confident on test day. As our partners, here a few reminders to help your student perform their best on test day (and every other day):

- 1) **Prioritize Rest**: Adequate sleep is important for brain function and overall well-being. Ensuring your child gets enough rest can significantly improve memory, concentration, and performance. Research suggests that adults need 7-9 hours of sleep each night, while teenagers need 8-10 hours, and younger children need even more.
- 2) **Fuel with Nutrition**: A healthy breakfast fuels the body and mind, providing the energy and nutrients necessary for optimal cognitive functioning. Encourage your child to eat a balanced meal to support their performance on test day.
- 3) **Promote Mental Preparation**: In addition to physical well-being, mental preparedness is equally important. Encourage your child to stay calm and focused by practicing techniques such as deep

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breathing, visualizing success, and positive self-talk. These strategies can help to reduce stress and enhance performance.

In CCUSD, student success is our top priority. We are dedicated to providing a supportive and engaging learning environment, led by passionate educators committed to nurturing the growth and development of every student.

As our students embark on this assessment journey, we extend our best wishes to each and every one of them. May they approach these assessments with confidence, knowing that they are prepared and that their worth extends far beyond a test score. Arizona's Tax Credit Program



Arizona's tax law (ARS 43-1089.01) allows families a tax credit of up to \$400 if they contribute to extracurricular activities in public schools. Individuals can give up to \$200. Contributions that are made on or before the fifteenth day of the fourth month (April 15), following the close of the taxable year, may be applied to either the current or preceding taxable year and is considered to have been made the last day of that taxable year.

Extracurricular activities are school-sponsored activities that may require enrolled students to pay a fee, including fees for:

- Extracurricular activities.
- Character education programs.
- Standardized testing fees for college credit or readiness offered by a widely recognized and accepted educational testing organization.
- Preparation courses and materials for standardized testing.
- The career and technical education industry certification assessment.
- Cardiopulmonary resuscitation training pursuant to A.R.S. 15-718.01.

From and after June 30, 2019 through June 30, 2024, these items are also Tax Credit eligible:

- Capital items (example: furniture, furnishings, athletic equipment, computer software, pupil & nonpupil transportation vehicles & equipment, textbooks, instructional aids, library books)
- Student consumable health care supplies (example: tissues, hand wipes, bandages)
- Playground equipment, shade structures for playground equipment

A single individual or a head of household can use the tax credit for \$200. A married couple filing a joint return can use the tax credit for \$400. Tax credit donations made on or before April 15th may be applied to either the current or preceding tax year.

ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?





Arizona Voter Registration Eligibility

YOU MUST BE REGISTERED 29 DAYS PRIOR TO AN ELECTION TO BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN THAT ELECTION. STATE LAW REQUIRES ARIZONA RESIDENTS MEET THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA TO REGISTER:

- A citizen of the United States of America. This includes any U.S. citizen who has never resided in the United States but whose parent is a United States citizen registered to vote in Arizona (A.R.S. § 16-103).
- Ø 18-years old on or before the date of the next general election.
- Not convicted of a felony or treason, unless civil rights have been restored.
- Able to write his or her name or make his or her mark, unless physically disabled.
- ❷ Not adjudicated an incapacitated person (A.R.S. § 14-5101).





The presenter, Rick Kamel from Phoenix said, "My goal is to provide those who attend this presentation, detailed insight into the strategies and tactics I used to facilitate a safe, speedy and smooth rescue. My hope is by telling my story, I will offer meaningful insight should a disabling trail mishap befall others hikers or bike riders." Rick Kamel is entirely retired and moved to Phoenix 5 years ago from the mid-west. He is an avid mountain and desert hiker as well as pavement walker averaging over 125 miles/month.
