## Demographics Summary

## Special Education:

The following sources from across the district were used to review the Special Education data by the District Education Improvement Council: State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) results, Performance Based Monitoring Assessment System (PBMAS) and State Performance Plan (SPP) indicators to determine strengths and needs of our Special Education students. In addition, the Special Education Department was very involved in the curriculum writing and revision for grades K-12 during the summer to ensure that the general curriculum meets the needs of our special education students. Professional development is also coordinated with the curriculum and instruction department to ensure that all general education teachers are well versed in best practices that support the learning of special education students.

## Needs:

System Safeguards Data: As evidenced in the STAAR assessments, the results show an achievement gap as follows:

- In Reading, the achievement gap between SpEd and All students 2016-2017 is 28%.
- The **READING** achievement gap between SpEd and All students in 2017-2018 is **29%**.
- In Math, the achievement gap between SpEd and All students 2016-2017 is 29%.
- The **MATH** achievement gap between SpEd and All students in 2017-2018 is **23%**.
- In Science, the achievement gap between SpEd and All students 2016-2017 is 14%.
- \*In **SCIENCE**, the 2017-2018 TEA results were masked due to small numbers to protect student confidentiality.
- In Social Studies, the achievement gap between SpEd and All students 2016-2017 is 4%.
- \*In **SOCIAL STUDIES**, the 2017-2018 TEA results were masked due to small numbers to protect student confidentiality.

## Personnel Needs:

The Campus Administration must work closely with the Special Education department to ensure that highly qualified teachers and instructional assistants are recruited, hired, and placed in the appropriate educational setting and to implement the inclusion model effectively.

## Professional Development Needs:

The campus administration must work closely with the Special Education Department and provide PD in the area of co-teaching to implement the co-teaching model effectively.

- In MATH, the achievement gap between all students and special education students went from 29% in 2016-2017 to 23% in 2017-2018.

#### NEEDS IMPROVEMENT:

- In Reading the achievement gap between SpEd and all students went from 31% in 2015 – 2016 to 28% in 2016-2017 and back up to 29% in 2017-2018.

#### English Language Learners (ELL):

The following sources from across the district were used to review the Dual Language/English as a Second Language (DL/ESL) Department data by the District Education Improvement Council: State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) results, Performance Based Monitoring Assessment System (PBMAS) and TELPAS indicators to determine strengths and needs of our ELL students. The DL Department also worked closely with the human resource department to ensure that highly qualified teachers and instructional assistants were recruited, hired, and placed in the appropriate educational setting. Each curriculum and instruction central office administrator by campus type was also assigned an English Language and Spanish Language Development coach to enhance bi-literacy. In addition, the DL Department was very involved in the curriculum writing and revision for grades K-12 during the summer to address the needs of our ELL students and align the curriculum between English and Spanish Language Arts that led to a more coherent and consistent bi-literacy program. Professional development was also coordinated with the curriculum and instruction department to ensure that all general education teachers utilize best practices that support the learning of ELL students.

#### Needs:

As evidenced in the STAAR assessments, the results show an achievement gap as follows:

- In Reading, the achievement gap between ELL and All students 2016-2017 is 21%.
- The READING gap between all students and EL students in 2017-2018 is 21%.
- In Math, the achievement gap between ELL and All students 2016-2017 is 12%.
- The MATH gap between all students and EL students in 2017-2018 is **16%**.
- In Writing, the achievement gap between ELL and All students 2016-2017 is 31%.
- In WRITING, the 2017-2018 TEA results were masked due to small numbers to protect student confidentiality.
- In Science, the achievement gap between ELL and All students 2016-2017 is 27%.
- In SCIENCE, the 2017-2018 TEA results were masked due to small numbers to protect student confidentiality.
- In Social Studies, the achievement gap between ELL and All students 2016-2017 is 25%.
- In SOCIAL STUDIES, the 2017-2018 TEA results were masked due to small numbers to protect student confidentiality.

System Safeguards Data: As evidenced in the STAAR assessments, the results show an achievement gap as follows:

- In Reading, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2016-2017 is 3%.
- In READING, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2017-2018 is **2%**.
- In Math, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2016-2017 is 2%.
- In MATH, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2017-2018 remained at 2%.
- In Writing, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2016-2017 is 2%.
- In WRITING, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2017-2018 is **3%**.
- In Science, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2016-2017 is 3%.
- In SCIENCE, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2017-2018 is **2%**.
- In Social Studies, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2016-2017 is 3%.
- In SOCIAL STUDIES, the achievement gap between Eco Dis and All students 2017-2018 is **1%**.

#### Economically Disadvantaged

##### Strengths:

- In Reading, the gap between ALL students and Economically Disadvantaged students was narrowed by 1%. It went from 3% in 2016-2017 to 2% in 2017-2018 on the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness.
- In Writing, the gap between ALL students and Economically Disadvantaged students increased by 1%. It went from 2% in 2016-2017 to 3% in 2017-2018.
- In Math, the gap between ALL students and Economically Disadvantaged students remained the same at 2% in both the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 school years.
- In Science, the gap between ALL students and Economically Disadvantaged students was narrowed by 1%. It went from 3% in 2016-2017 to 2% in 2017-2018.
- In Social Studies, the gap between ALL students and Economically Disadvantaged students was narrowed by 2%. The gap went from 3% in 2016-2017 to 1% in 2017-2018.
