Hacienda La Puente Unified Students to Benefit from \$21 Million Community Schools Grant

Hacienda La Puente Unified has been chosen as a recipient of the California Community Schools Partnership Program's (CCSPP) third cohort, an esteemed honor that includes \$21.3 million in state board-approved community school implementation grants, highlighting the District's commitment to advancing innovative student learning initiatives and developing mental health and community engagement solutions.

State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond and the California State Board of Education (SBE) announced the expansion of the CCSPP and its recipients on May 8, with 17 schools from Hacienda La Puente Unified among those celebrated. The District plans to follow the

community schools model to strengthen enrichment programs, increase student academic support, and improve resources for students and families. The grant, which will be distributed over five years, will begin with a planning phase this summer and continue through the first half of the 2024-25 school year.

Following the CCSPP framework, the District will partner with education, county, and other nonprofit entities to introduce a range of services and resources to its campuses, including expanded health services – both physical and mental – enhanced instructional support services, and increased family and community engagement initiatives.

Over the course of the five years, each site will strengthen its existing community school efforts by leveraging the expertise of community school professionals. These specialists will play a crucial role in partnering with stakeholders and community agencies to address students' academic, physical, and social-emotional needs

La Puente High School Earns 2024 California Democracy School for Strong Civic Leadership



La Puente High School was named a 2024 California Democracy School during the Los Angeles County Office of Education's California Civic Learning Student Showcase and Award Ceremony on May 11.

La Puente High School is one of only four schools recognized as a 2024 California Democracy School by the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE), receiving the honor for its high-quality civic learning, commitment to strengthening democracy, and pursuit of happiness for future generations across the District community.

The award-winning schools were honored during LACOE's 2024 California Civic Learning Student Showcase and Award Ceremony at the Richard Nixon Presidential Library Museum on May 11, where students, families, staff, principal Dr. Lisa Lopez, and local representatives gathered to learn more about the students' initiatives throughout the 2023-24 school year and celebrate their successes.

During the event, La Puente students shared their civic engagement projects, including recently investigated and proposed city solutions, robust volunteer and community service endeavors, and school safety enhancements.

Four HLPUSD Schools Honored for Excellence in Real-World, Civic Learning

Wilson High School's campus media center into a stateof-the-art space stocked with cutting-edge technology thanks to \$850,000 in Community Project Funds delivered by Congresswoman Linda Sánchez. Funding for the media center project at Glen A. Wilson High was announced during the 22nd Annual 38th Congressional District Student Art Competition on April 26. The funds were presented in the form of a giant check and presented to Glen A. Wilson High School Principal Dr. Danielle Kenfield and District representatives moments after

two Hacienda La Puente Unified students were named first- and second-place art show winners. Glen A. Wilson's media center has served as a learning hub since the late 1960s and is still a meeting place for parent and

community meetings and for students to collaborate on project work. The center is set to undergo significant upgrades beginning in the 2024-2025 school year and is expected to be completed in Dec. 2026.

During the annual art show, Los Altos High School senior Amber Juarez won first place with a \$1,000 scholarship, and Wilson High sophomore Samantha Hung took second place with a \$400 scholarship. As the grand prize winner, Juarez will represent the 38th District at the national Congressional Art Competition in Washington, D.C. Her piece, entitled "Love Sorrow," will compete against student artwork from across the country and will be on display at the U.S. Capitol for one year. 
