For many kids, summertime means food, friends, and fun. For families who count on school

breakfast and lunch, however, the summer months can be stressful and family food budgets have to be stretched even further. Free summer meals (breakfast and lunch) funded by the USDA, will be available to kids and teens ages 18 and younger at the Black Hawk School district DURING THE WEEKDAYS OF THE SUMMER SCHOOL SESSIONS (July 22 THROUGH August 9). Children DO NOT NEED TO BE ENROLLED IN THE SUMMER SCHOOL TO PARTICIPATE IN THE FREE BREAKFASTS AND LUNCHES.

BREAKFAST will be served from 7:45 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. LUNCH will be served from 11:15 a.m.-12:00 p.m.

Many summer meal sites offer fun learning and recreation activities so kids and teens can eat a healthy meal while staying active and being with friends. Sites are also registered with the USDA and are held at safe local places like schools, churches, and community centers.

## FREE SUMMER PROGRAM MEAL DETAILS:

Meals are FREE TO ALL CHILDREN AGES 18 AND YOUNGER who come to a summer school meal site. Free summer meals will help families SAVE MONEY and stretch their already tight food budgets. Food served is HEALTHY AND FOLLOWS USDA NUTRITION GUIDELINES. Summer meal sites are at fun, safe places for kids and teens to be active and visit with friends. No application or proof of income is needed. You can just bring your child to a summer meals site in your community.

# When School's Out, Summer EBT is Here to Help!

Summer EBT (Electronic Benefit Transfer) is an income-based program that helps families buy food for their children while school is out. Wisconsin will send \$120 for each child who qualifies. You can use these benefits anywhere that FoodShare benefits are accepted, like most grocery stores, many convenience stores, and some farmer's markets.

## Your child should get benefits automatically if:

- Your child was approved to get free or reduced price meals at their National School Lunch Program school.
- You have given your child's school an alternate household income form that shows you meet the income requirements for Summer EBT.
- Your child is school-aged and your household is part of FoodShare, W-2, the Food Distribution
  Program on Indian Reservations, or an income-based Medicaid program; or if we know they
  are a migrant, in foster care, or experiencing homelessness.



Watch your mail towards the end of June! If your family qualifies, you'll get a letter about your child's benefits.



Getting Summer EBT will **not** affect your child's or family's immigration status.





# What if I think my child might qualify for benefits but my family does not participate in any of the programs listed on this flyer?

- If your child's school participates in the National School Lunch Program, you can apply for Free
  or Reduced Price Lunch (FRPL) through their school. If your child's application is approved, you
  will get Summer EBT.
- If you apply and are approved by August 29 for one of the state benefit programs mentioned
  on the front of this flyer, you will be able to get Summer EBT for your child. You can learn more
  about other state benefit programs by calling 211 or visiting <a href="access.wi.gov">access.wi.gov</a>.

We will continue to send benefits to eligible families throughout the summer as we get their information. If you have recently moved, update your address at <a href="SummerEBT.wi.gov/s/SummerBenefitInfo">SummerBenefitInfo</a>.

## How will my family get benefits?

If your child qualifies for Summer EBT and you already have a QUEST card or a P-EBT card from the pandemic, we will put your benefits on that card. If you don't, we'll mail you a new QUEST card.

# What if my family doesn't get Summer EBT in June and we think we should have?

If you do not get benefits in June, we might not have enough information to know if your child qualifies for Summer EBT. For us to get that information, you should complete a Summer EBT Application. You can access the Summer EBT application at Summer EBT.wi.gov/s/SummerEBTApp.

## Can our family still use other summer food benefits if we get Summer EBT?

Yes! If your child gets Summer EBT they can still participate in other programs like the Summer Food Service Program or the Seamless Summer Option.

The Warrior Pack Program, a weekend food program for food insecure Black Hawk students, has received a grant from the South Wayne Area Community Fund of the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin.

The grant received will be dedicated solely to acquiring weekend foods and snacks for the classroom, aimed at supporting the nutrition of vulnerable students at Black Hawk. The South Wayne Area Community Fund, known for its contributions to the arts, education, environmental initiatives, health, human services, and the preservation of history, has shown remarkable support for the Warrior Pack Program.

Travis and Tiffany Signer, dedicated educators at Black Hawk, along with Melissa Pickett, a district staff member, all of whom volunteer their time to the project, shared their heartfelt thanks. They remarked, "We are incredibly fortunate that the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin and the South Wayne Area Community Fund share our vision of eliminating hunger among the students of Black Hawk. The generous grant we've received is pivotal in our ongoing efforts to support students facing food insecurity."

Currently, the Warrior Pack Program assists 52 students by supplying them with healthy, non-perishable food items. The sole expenditure of the Warrior Pack Program is the purchase of food. During 2023, the initiative distributed 2,186 food packs for weekends to students at Black Hawk.

# **Changes to Wisconsin 2024-2025 School Immunization Requirements**

The State of Wisconsin released new changes to DHS 144 this past week which includes changes to the laws covering school vaccine entry requirements. These changes were made to bring Wisconsin closer in line to the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices across the nation and in line with our neighboring states' school requirements.

Wisconsin statute will still continue to permit waivers to vaccination for reasons of health, religious, or personal conviction. If there is a new immunization requirement for your student, a new conviction WILL need to be completed.

## Changes for 2024-2025 School Year

For entry into 5K through 7<sup>th</sup> grade students need:

- 4 doses of polio vaccine
- 3 doses of hepatitis B
- 4 doses of DTaP/DTP/DT/TD
- 2 doses of varicella (chicken pox) no longer accepting reports of disease moving forward.

Must be diagnosed by a qualified healthcare provider (MD, DO, NP, PA)

- 2 doses of MMR
- · 1 Tdap at 7<sup>th</sup> grade
- 1 MenACWY-containing vaccine at 7<sup>th</sup> grade

For entry into 12<sup>th</sup> grade:

1 MenACWY-containing booster (2<sup>nd</sup> dose in series)

I will be reviewing immunization records throughout the summer months and will send notification home prior to the start of the school year to allow parents/guardians sufficient time to get their student vaccinated prior to the October deadline. 



# School District of Black Hawk Regular Meeting April 10, 2024



The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm in the Business Room by President Dee Paulson. The following members were Clayton Ruegsegger, Val Dunlavey, Kerry Holland, Jason Figi, Jim Baumgartner, Mindy Stauffacher and Dee Paulson. Also present was Administration of Willy Chambers and Cory Milz and 6 Guest.

At the start of the meeting we recognized Kerry Holland for his 18 years of service to the District and he was presented with a clock. Motion by Holland and seconded by Figi to consent to agenda moving item 4.c.a.a to after executive session. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Administration report:

Chambers: I have attached a document displaying some of the contributions CESA #3 provided to the Black Hawk School District.

I received the information from CESA #3 yesterday for the CESA delegate, which you typically delegate in the organizational meeting.

Mr. Milz, Ms. Gastel, Mrs. McCauley and I spent Monday and Tuesday of this week training for the required training for Act 20 for administrators. We have four more days where we have training to do. There is more work to this than meets the eye to do it correctly. We plan to stay with our current curriculum so we will need to do a Crosswalk to verify that we meet the Act 20 requirements. I also have scheduled the training for the K-3 grade teachers as legislation requires. In essence, this becomes an unfunded mandate for this portion of the work.

I have picked up 10 tables from CESA #3 and will pick up 10 more tomorrow. The first 10 were placed in Mrs. Bredeson's room, she said she preferred to have different tables from her former tables. The others are intended for the new Tutor/Flex space. The tables cost \$100 each and for new versions of the same tables they are over \$600 each.

As you know I was unable to attend the Board/Employee dinner due to a family issue. I assume as always everything went well.

I thank Jake Boss and Eric Berget for working together to get our bus out of the field on County D past the old cheese factory south of town. Jake donated his time, the use of his end loader, and tailings. Eric was very reasonable in his charges. At least \$1000 was saved due to their efforts.

Construction is going well. Unfortunately, demolition of the old building is going to take at least 7 weeks which was originally slated for 4 weeks. The schedule change forced a change to the summer school time frame. I appreciate the willingness of Mr. Milz and other staff to make this work.

**Milz:** - Big shout out to our students and directors, Mr. Amweg and Mr. Duff-Bowers for their excelling in the musical, Shrek. Great job by all, very entertaining.

Andrew Figi, selected to play in Children's Hospital/WFCA all-star game, is selling t-shirts to raise money for Children's Hospital.

Ms. Crotty and the guidance program has provided Brian Kenney to work with staff and students on leadership, community, and positive attitudes. This Friday, April 12, Brian will be working with our middle school students. He will follow with K-2nd grade on April-2 and 3rd-5th grade students on May 2nd.

Thursday, April 11th will be statewide tornado/severe weather alert day. An all-state drill will take place at 1:45 p.m.

Congratulations to the following members of the BH forensics team for qualifying for the Wisconsin forensics state festival on April 19. On April 4, 18 sophomore and junior students attended the Green County Youth Apprenticeship Fair to submit resumes and learn about apprenticeship opportunities in the area.

Prom is coming up on April 27. We are running a shuttle bus to support students who cannot drive and otherwise would not be able to get transportation to the event.

Saturday, April 13 - 14 students will attend the Green Bay Packer Girls Flag Football Open. The Green Bay Packers organization provided \$1000 towards travel expenses.
