Athlete- Spring Track & Field, Winter Track, Soccer, Gymnastics Shawnee High School Class of 1984





Named the "1984 Shawnee High School Outstanding Female Athlete of the Year," Kathy Todd Reimet had an impressive career as a multi-sport athlete at Shawnee, earning a total of twelve varsity letters among four different sports. During her freshman and sophomore years, Kathy earned varsity status in Gymnastics, Spring Track & Field and Winter Track. She continued earning varsity as a junior and senior in Spring Track & Field and Winter Track, while adding Soccer to that list! Kathy excelled in High Hurdles, Low Hurdles, Long Jump, High Jump, 400 Meters, 800 Meters, and 4 x 400 Relay in Track & Field. In Gymnastics, her focus was both the Vault and Beam, and in Soccer, she played the positions of Center Forward/Striker and Wing.

Kathy set Shawnee school records in the 1600 Meter Relay, Sprint Medley, High Hurdles and Long Jump between the years of 1982 and 1984. In 1984, Kathy also saw success as the **Group IV Winter Track State Champion** with a meet record in the Sprint Medley. Kathy's leadership skills led her to Captain her 1984 team in total points to being #1 in South Jersey after 3 previous straight undefeated seasons (1982, 1983, 1984). As a varsity Soccer player and Captain, Kathy was the leading goal scorer in 1982 and was named the All Burlington County Leading Goal Scorer in 1983.

Kathy's focus and talent did not end in Athletics. Academically, Kathy was in the Advanced Art Major student program in her junior and senior years.



Kathy attended West Chester University where she graduated Cum Laude and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Exercise Science (1988) and a Bachelor's Degree in Health & Physical Education (1990). At West Chester, Kathy earned a total of six varsity letters in her freshman and sophomore years in Soccer, (Center Forward/Striker and Wing), Winter Track, and Spring Track & Field (400 IM Hurdles, High Hurdles, 4 x 400 Relay, Long Jump, and Triple Jump). She continued earning varsity letters in Soccer during her junior and senior years, for a total of eight varsity letters across three sports at the collegiate level.

Kathy was named 1984-1988 WCU Women's Soccer Leading Scorer all 4 years; she set WCU School Records in the Long Jump and in the Shuttle Hurdle Relay; she was a member of the ECAC All-East Track Team; PSAC Team Champions and Individual PSAC Silver Medalist in the 400 IM Hurdles. Kathy was a Medalist at the Rutgers Adidas Relays, Towson Invitational, University of Delaware Indoor Championships, William & Mary's Colonial Relays, Princeton Relays and the ECAC Indoor Track Championships.

Kathy currently lives in Ocean City, NJ with her husband Mark and children Todd and Summer. Kathy works in the field of Operations & Event Planning, and is the Operations and Special Events Manager for The Hero Campaign.
