



If there was ever a Shawnee Renegade who embodied the spirit of tenacity, it would be Holly McGarvie Reilly. Although a talented field hockey player and track athlete, Holly was known for her skills as a mentally and physically tough lacrosse athlete. While earning ten varsity letters while at Shawnee, Holly was the state champion in the 4 x 800 relay, had a second place finish in the 800 meter, and was named a US Lacrosse High School All-American in 2004 and 2005, and named All-State and All-Conference field hockey player. Holly served her teammates as captain of the field hockey, lacrosse and track teams and was also voted as Shawnee High School's Athlete of the Year in 2005. In true Renegade fashion, Holly's accomplishments were not limited to athletics, as she was a National Honor Society member and the Valedictorian for her graduating class of 2005.



After leaving Shawnee, Holly attended Princeton University as an Anthropology and Environmental Studies major, graduating in 2009. During her time at Princeton, Holly continued to play both field hockey and lacrosse, where she earned an additional eight varsity letters as a starter for both sports all four years. She started every single field hockey and lacrosse game during her entire time at Princeton. Of the many accolades received at Princeton, Holly was the Ivy League Rookie of the Year (2006,) was the *Emily Goodfellow Award* winner (2009,) the Lacrosse Ivy League Co-Player of the Year (2009,) Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association 1st Team All-American Honors (2008, 2009,) and one of five recipients of the *C. Otto von Kienbusch Award* as the University's top female athlete (2009).

In her post-Princeton years, Holly continued playing lacrosse, and was gold medalist in the World Lacrosse Championship (FIL) both in the 2009 (Prague, Czech Republic,) and 2013 (Oshawa, Canada,) games. She was a member of the "Boston Storm" for the first-ever women's professional lacrosse league (2016,) and was named a 2016 United Women's Lacrosse League Defensive All-Star. Holly has been featured in Women's Professional Lacrosse League "Pro Day" and blog post in *Inside Lacrosse*, and has most recently been drafted to play for the Philadelphia Fire (league play to begin summer of 2018). In 2018, following a very exciting high school season as coach, Holly was named Orange County Female High School Coach of the Year.

Professionally, Holly is the owner/founder of Renegade Lacrosse, an organization created to inspire the next generation of lacrosse players through clinics and small-group training. She is also the high school lacrosse coach at St. Margaret's Episcopal School in San Juan Capistrano, California. Holly holds a position on the Executive Board of the US Lacrosse Orange County Chapter, and started the first-ever lacrosse team at Ballou Senior High School in Southeast D.C., which was the second-ever public school lacrosse team in D.C.

Holly and her spouse Brendan are parents to Finnegan and live in San Clemente, California. In addition to coaching, continuing professional lacrosse play and working in leadership development, Holly is self-employed as Owner and Director of *Holly Reilly Sports, LLC*.
