Conover Hall Netball Tournament: 3rd w/e of September. Selected players/two teams 2 night weekend residential in Shropshire.

4th Form Ski Trip: First week of the Easter Break. One week, open to any L4/U4, all standards from complete beginners to expert skiers.

Lanzarote Multi sports Tour: One weekend of August, open to anyone U3 - U5 swimming and other sports. This trip generally goes ahead biennially.

Rhineland trip: Early May bank holiday w/e, alternate years. Three night tour of the Rhineland with a focus on German language and culture. Open to L4, U4, L5.

Australia Exchange: Year 9/Upper 4 - 4 participants per year, following a rigorous application and selection procedure. 9 weeks in Melbourne in the spring term, exchange partner returns to spend 9 weeks staying with partners in England during the summer term.

Music Tour: 4 nights, departing immediately after the end of Summer Term. Open to musicians from U4 upwards. Recent destinations have included Malta, Ireland, Prague, Slovenia and Sweden. The group perform a series of concerts and sing in church services, and there are plenty of opportunities for cultural visits.

Battlefields Trip: Early in the summer term, the entire U4 cohort take two days out of school to undertake an overnight trip to the Great War battlefields in Belgium. Whilst supporting the History curriculum, this has a much broader impact and we consider it to be a very important cultural experience for all our young people. It is therefore funded directly from fees; no additional charge is made.

Lacrosse/Netball tour: alternating between the two sports in alternate years. Departs immediately after the end of term. Selected team players travelling to the USA (Lacrosse) or Caribbean/S Africa (netball) for an 8 day elite tour.

Languages trips: GCSE and A level students participate in a 5 – 7 night trip staying with host families and attending language classes, as well as cultural visits in France, Germany or Spain. Fifth form trips take place towards the end of the Easter hols, sixth for trip travels during October half term.

Classics trip: A short residential trip to locations such as Rome, Athens, Sicily with guided tours of significant sites from the Classical World. Offered to GCSE and A level students, extended to any others with an interest if spaces are available.

Drama Trip: GCSE Drama and A2 theatre studies students, a cultural trip which will take including some productions. Offered to GCSE and A level students, extended to any others with an interest if spaces are available. Departs at the start of the Easter Holiday.

The Jennifer Bate Organ Academy: A residential hosted at St Cat's for organists from St Cats and other schools who apply to join the course. The event includes masterclasses from prestigious visiting organists as well as opportunities to play and listen to each other. Using the two organs at St Cat's and visiting local churches & Guildford Cathedral. Takes place in the middle of the Easter Hols (depending on when the Easter Weekend falls).

Art & History of Art trip: 3-night residential trip to destinations such as Florence or Paris to visit galleries & other cultural destinations, with expert guides. Offered to GCSE and A level students, extended to any others with an interest if spaces are available.

Physics Trip to CERN: A level physicists have an opportunity for a 2-night trip to Switzerland to see and find out more about the Large Hadron Collider. Departs immediately after the end of term.

Edinburgh Fringe: A level Theatre Studies groups have sometimes been able to take their work to perform at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, depending on its quality and their commitment to such a challenge. Late August.

Geography Field Trip: 2-night residential trip to Devon which is a course requirement for A level geographers. Mid-September

L6 Expedition: Prestigious, flagship Sixth Form opportunity. 18-day expedition to a developing world destination, for cultural experiences, remote trekking and a volunteering project in a local community. Recent destinations include: 2022- Borneo, 2023 – Cambodia, 2024 – Tanzania, 2025 – Ecuador. Open to anyone in L6, departing first weekend after the end of the summer term.

D of E: Bronze award – 2-night training and assessed expedition in U4 activities week. Not too far away!

Silver Award – 2-night practice expedition over a weekend following school exams in L5. 1 day training and 2 night assessed expedition during U5 activities week. Typically South Downs area.

Gold Award – 3-night training and practice expedition in the last week of the Easter hols L6, 4 night assessed expedition in late August. Typically, Dartmoor & Mid Wales.

Activities week: Activities week is the last full week of the summer term, typically the first week in July, Monday – Friday followed by Speech Day on Saturday. Activities week for U3 – L5 is funded from fees; there is not additional charge. The U4 Battlefields trip is similarly funded

U3 have a two-night camping trip to Midhurst. The rest of the week involves some very diverse activities on site at School.

L4 travel to Wales for a week of challenging outdoor activities. They stay in dorms (or possibly luxury bell-tents!) at a specialist residential centre deep in Bannau Brycheiniog.

U4 have two days of activities in school and a three-day expedition, which includes D of E training for those choosing to enrol for the Bronze Award (usually almost everyone!).

L5 have a 3 night/4 day residential trip, which will be new for 2025. Details TBC! The fifth day is in school for the SATRO Business Challenge.

U5 D of E silver award candidates undertake their assessed expedition. Those not involved in D of E undertake a local conservation environmental volunteering programme with the Wey & Arun Canal Trust.
