JHB, Truancy

TRUANCY

If a student is absent without a valid and verified parent/guardian (parent) excuse or if the student leaves school or a class without permission of the teacher or administrator in charge, the student shall be considered truant. A "habitual truant" shall be defined as a student of compulsory attendance who has four total days unexcused absences from school in any one month or 10 total days unexcused absences from school during any school year. Absences due to suspension or expulsion shall not be counted toward a designation of "habitually truant."

In order to reduce the incidents of truancy, parents of all students will be notified in writing at the beginning of each school year of their obligation to ensure that their children of compulsory attendance age attend school. Parents shall be required to acknowledge in writing awareness of their obligations and to furnish the school with a telephone number or other means of contacting them during the school day.

The school shall establish a system of monitoring individual unexcused absences. When a student fails to report on a regularly scheduled school day or class period, and school personnel have received no indication that his or her parent is aware of the absence, school personnel or volunteers under the direction of school personnel will notify the parent.

A plan may be developed for a student who is at risk of being declared habitually truant with the goal of assisting the child to remain in school.

In accordance with law, the district may impose appropriate penalties that relate directly to classes missed while truant. Truancy from school and class may result in consequences as outlined in Board policy and/or court referral through the local judicial system. Classification as a habitual truant is cause for judicial proceedings to be initiated to enforce compulsory attendance.
