2. **Create a Google Slides** presentation recommending why someone should read this book. Include: Author, title, characters, setting, details from the story. * Presentation must be 3 slides
3. **Create a Google Drawing** showing a scene from the story. You must include at least 2 sentences describing the scene.
4. **Create a Poster Board** showing the following elements of the novel:
 - Your favorite part (using an illustration of clip art) and explain why using complete sentences.
 - Your favorite characters (using an illustration or clip art) and explain why using complete sentences.
