Facts of Construction Cost Trends

- Given the significant growth in labor and materials costs that have already occurred year-todate and the expected pace of construction activity through the end of the year, construction costs have increased by approximately 14.1% in 2022.
- Current costs for construction is at an all time high, but contractors expect that cost escalation will continue through 2023.
- Continued supply chain issues cause unexpected delays and more cost.
- Stabilizing material costs are offset by rising labor costs.
- Competition in the market and high demand for construction will keep costs up.
- Increasing interest rates and ancillary costs contribute to rising construction costs.

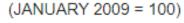

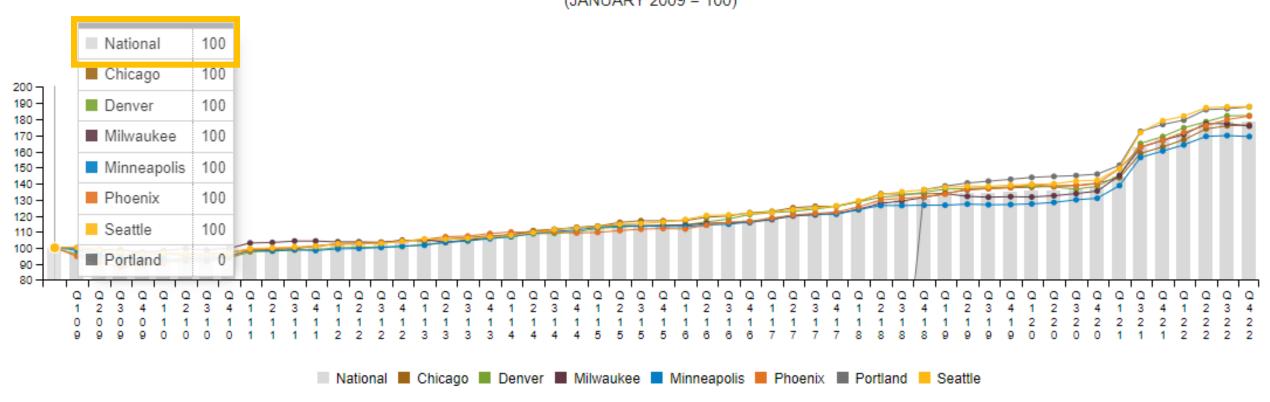

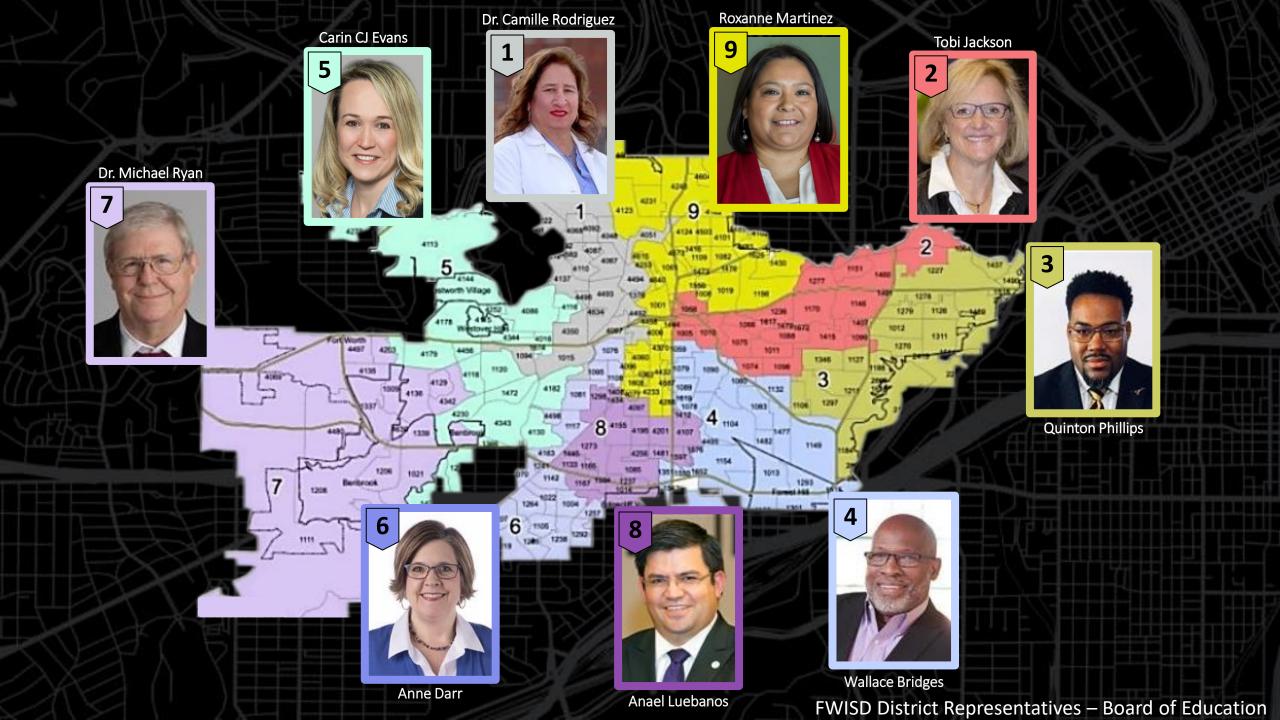

Overall Construction Cost Index Q4 2022







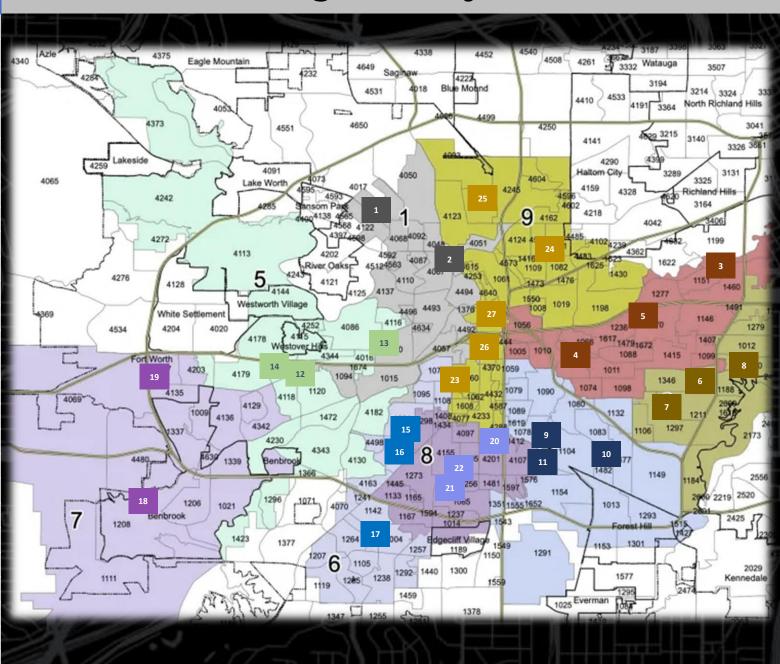

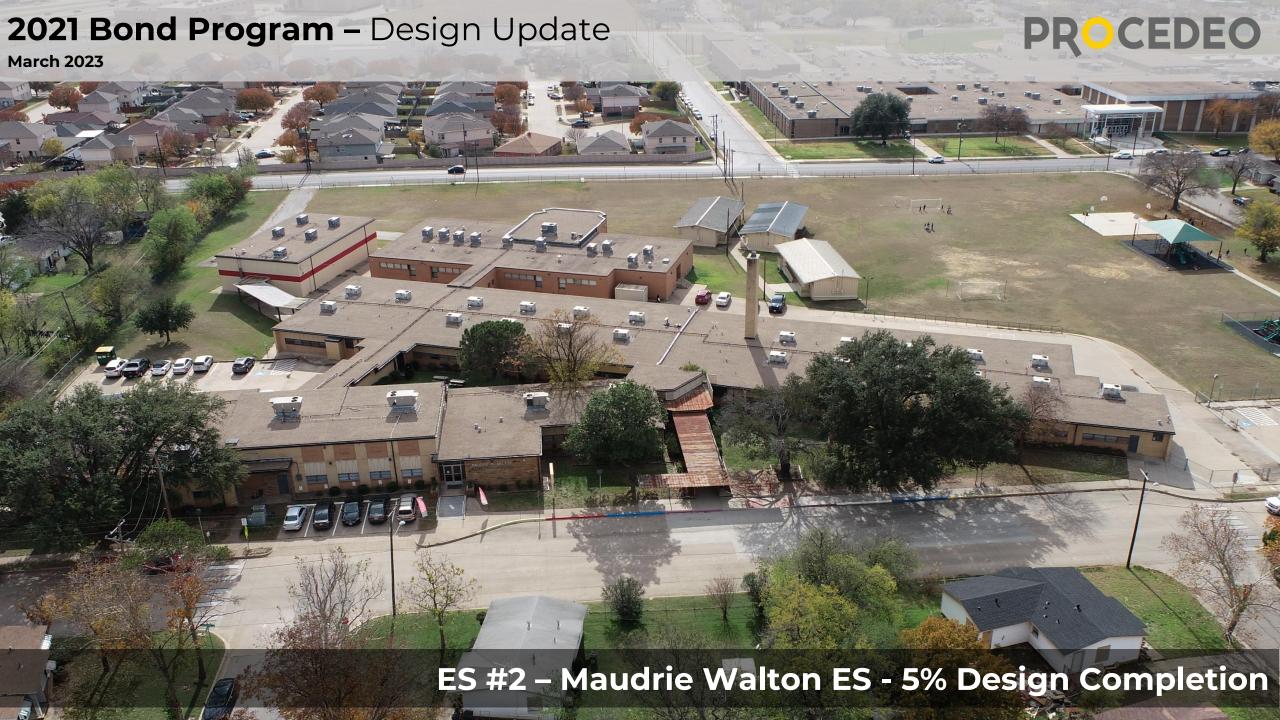
