Driving, Parking, & Traffic Regulations

The regulations listed below are issued to promote safety and order in the driveways and parking lots around the school. Failure to comply with the regulations and conditions can result in revocation of driving and/or disciplinary action.

1. Any student who wants to drive to school and use the school parking lot must report the vehicle make/ model, color, and license plate number annually through the online registration process.
2. Any student's vehicle on school property is subject to search upon reasonable suspicion by school officials without a student's consent, without a search warrant, and with no notice per ISD #111 Policy 527. If a student refuses a request by a school official to open a locked motor vehicle, parking privileges may be withdrawn and the student may be subject to discipline.
3. The maximum speed limit in all driveways and parking lots is 10 mph. All traffic laws are enforced.
4. Students may use the lower parking lot in front of the high school. Parking in a fire lane is a serious offense; the first violation will be a warning, the second time the vehicle will be towed at the owner's expense.
5. Students may not go to their vehicles between 8:15 am and 2:51 pm unless they are leaving the school property with an approved early dismissal, or unless they have permission from the principal or designee.
6. Any evidence of reckless or careless driving will result in the suspension of driving privileges. Drivers are to obey any parking lot supervisors.
7. Should it be necessary to revoke a driving privilege and the student involved is found driving on school property, it will be considered a very serious violation. The first violation will result in an additional suspension of driving privileges for a period of time determined by the principal. The second violation will result in revocation of driving privileges for the rest of the school year. It also will be considered insubordination, and the student may be suspended from school for a period of time determined by the principal or designee.
8. Students must avoid any unnecessary noise while driving on school property.
9. Parking or driving on the school lawn will be considered an offense and will result in loss of driving privileges and possible charges for damage to property.
10. In the event of a repeated and/or serious violation of parking and driving rules, a complaint may be filed by the school with the Carver County Sheriff's Department.
11. School buses have the right of way at all times. A violation may result in suspension of driving privileges or disciplinary action.
12. Parking in visitor, posted reserve, itinerant, or handicap spaces will result in immediate towing.
