Proposal for a "New" Ionia Community Library

Mercantile Bank recently donated its downtown Ionia offices to the ICL and the Library Board has said it believes the gift is an excellent chance to re-imagine your library. On August 2, voters will be asked to approve 0.98 mills for 20 years to fund the relocation, renovation, operation and maintenance of the new ICL at the former Bank.

The 22,000 square foot facility spans several historic, but vacant, Main St. buildings. Re-imagining them as the new ICL would give the library four times more space to serve ALL Ionia residents, including IPS students and families.




life saving skills in the event of a threat or crisis situation. Students and staff did an amazing job participating in this informative and important training drill.



These nights gave parents the opportunity to listen to their children read a smaller point book in the library and then take an Accelerated Reader test in the computer lab. It was such a blessing to be able to have parents back in the building for these fun, educational events!



For the first time in three years, we were very excited to host a Career Day! Rather's Career Day, which consisted of students rotating around from classroom to classroom to hear ten guest speakers, is an integral part of Rather's Schedule of School, Family, and Community Partnerships.
