## BISHOP'S CASE ADJOURNED.

**Charge Against Syrians Will Be  
Heard Next Tuesday—Lawyer  
Osborne Ill.**

When the case of Bishop Raphael Hawaweeny and fourteen of his followers, charged with assault and conspiracy, was called in the Butler street court this morning Magistrate Tighe announced to Assistant District Attorney Smith, who is prosecuting the case, that he had received letters from Lawyer James Osborne saying that Mr. Osborne would be unable to try the case, as he was suffering from throat trouble. "I think this case ought to go on to-day," said Assistant District Attorney Smith. "We have already granted several adjournments on Mr. Osborne's account."

Magistrate Tighe said that inasmuch as Mr. Osborne was ill he ought to be given another adjournment. He then set the case down for next Tuesday. The bishop and his followers, who were in court, were escorted to the cars by several detectives in charge of Capt. Harkins. There was no demonstration of any kind against the Syrians.
