

SAFETY & SECURITY UPGRADES!

Several years ago Ionia Public Schools (IPS) began a process of improving and upgrading our safety and security measures. We committed ourselves to implementing the best safety and security systems available. During this process, we collaborated with law enforcement and our security firm, and conducted site visits to other schools to view state-of-the-art security features.

This summer, we equipped every classroom and office in our district with our new comprehensive safety and security system. Every classroom and office now contains a Smart Boot door barricade device that instantaneously notifies administration and law enforcement when activated. All of our students and staff will receive training within the first several weeks of school using our enhanced safety devices. *continued on pg. 2*



OPERATING MILLAGE VOTE ON NOVEMBER 7, 2023

Our IPS non-homestead operating millage expires in December 2024. If our millage is not replaced, IPS will lose more than \$2.79 million annually; busing will be reduced, staff will be reduced, class sizes will increase, pay-to-play sports will be implemented, and cuts will be made to band, vocal music, and our arts programs.

Updates from Superintendent Gurk

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We have installed strobe lights in every hallway of each school that flash red in the event of a lockdown. We have also updated all of our school maps and installed larger external and internal door numbers to aid law enforcement in the event of an emergency. We have added fragment retention film to strengthen windows across our district. To help cover the costs of our comprehensive security upgrades, we have procured over \$315,000 in safety and security grants.





Our Trap Team fall season will consist of eight weeks beginning on September 14 and ending in October. Our Trap Team is open to IPS students in grades 6 - 12.

The registration fee is \$35.00 and must be paid through the league. Participants must register online with USA High School Clay Target League prior to September 11.

Go to www.claytargetgo.com and click on AMS, then register as a new athlete, team code ioa382. If you have been signed up in the past, login under your preexisting profile. Once your profile is created, we will be able to invite you to take the online SAFE Range Safety Training that MUST be completed prior to the season starting or any live fire practice. If you did this in the past then you will not have to again. Once the online portion is completed, print your certificate and bring it to our first practice along with your eye protection, ear protection, shotgun, and ammunition. We will then complete the Range Safety Field Day portion and will be able to begin live fire practice. Practice will begin on Thursday, September 14 at 6:00 pm at the Western Michigan Rifle and Pistol Club on Lincoln Avenue in Ionia.

All participants will need to provide their own shotgun and ammunition. Students will need 50 rounds (two boxes per night) and pay the West Michigan Rifle and Pistol Club \$5.00 per round (\$10 per night). The largest gauge allowed in the league is a 12 gauge. Participants also must use factory ammunition; no hand loads are allowed per league rules. Eye and ear protection are mandatory, and no open toed shoes or sandals are allowed.

If you are under 18, a parent or guardian will need to register for you. Please contact me with any questions. We look forward to having a safe and fun season competing!

Title IX Law & Grievance Procedures at Ionia Public Schools

Title IX prohibits harassment of both male and female students regardless of the sex of the harasser (i.e., even if the harasser and target are members of the same sex). It also prohibits gender-based harassment, which may include acts of verbal, nonverbal, or physical aggression, intimidation, or hostility based on sex or sex-stereotyping. Thus, it can be sex discrimination if students are harassed either for exhibiting what is perceived as a stereotypical characteristic of their sex, or failing to conform to stereotypical notions of masculinity and femininity. Title IX also prohibits sexual harassment and gender-based harassment of all students, regardless of the actual or perceived sexual orientation or gender identity of the harasser or target. Although Title IX does not prohibit discrimination based solely on sexual orientation, Title IX does protect all students, including lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) students, from sex discrimination. When students are subjected to harassment on the basis of their LGBT status, they may also be subjected to forms of sex discrimination prohibited under Title IX. The fact that the harassment includes anti-LGBT comments or is partly based on the targets actual or perceived sexual orientation does not relieve a school of its obligation under Title IX to investigate and remedy overlapping sexual harassment or gender-based harassment.

Investigation and Complaint Procedure

Any student who believes that s/he has been subjected to unlawful discrimination or retaliation may seek resolution of his/her complaint through the procedures described below. The formal complaint procedures involve an investigation of the individual's claims and a process for rendering a decision regarding whether the charges are substantiated.

Due to the sensitivity surrounding complaints of unlawful discrimination or retaliation, timelines are flexible for initiating the complaint process; however, individuals should make every effort to file a complaint within thirty (30) calendar days after the conduct occurs. Once the formal complaint process is begun, the investigation will be completed in a timely manner (ordinarily, within fifteen (15) business days of the complaint being received). The CO's will determine whether to do an informal or formal investigation based on board policy, including 2260. Details of the formal and informal investigation and appeal procedures can be found on the district website at www.ioniaschools.org.
