AP Spanish is an intense class for highly-motivated learners, and during this course you will fine tune your speaking, writing, reading and listening skills. My goal is for you to be successful on the AP exam in May 2025. In order for you to prepare for the course and maintain your Spanish skills over the summer, please read the following information carefully which includes:

- (A) Recommendations for helping you prepare for the course and language exam over the summer.
- (B) Class code for joining Google Classroom in order to upload summer work.
- (C) Mandatory assignments to be completed over the summer and submitted on Google Classroom by the first day of class.

A. Recommendations:

1. Read publications in Spanish on a weekly basis to maintain your reading skills and learn new vocabulary in the target language. Publications such as *Hola*, *People en español*, and *Variedades* may be found at bookstores such as Barnes and Noble or Hudson News. There are many online newspapers/news sites to peruse as well such as *El País* (España), *ABC* (España), BBC Mundo, CNN en español and *El Nuevo Herald* (Miami).
2. Watch television in Spanish on a weekly basis. Spanish language channels include *Univisión* and *Telemundo*, which may be available through your cable company. There are also a number of series in Spanish on Netflix and Amazon Prime. When watching a show, it is a good idea to **put the subtitles on in Spanish** to help you with your comprehension and acquire new vocabulary. Have a device with you so that you can look up new vocabulary on wordreference.com. DVDs are another option for listening to Spanish as well as *FluentU* online, which offers a 14-day free trial.

As you watch the show, news segment or movie, you will realize that you will not understand everything; however, with time your comprehension will increase. You can also stop and rewind to listen as many times as necessary to accustom yourself to the pace of speech and accent. Eventually you may be able to watch without any subtitles in Spanish!

3. Seek out opportunities to listen to “live” Spanish. There are cultural events and local churches that have activities and services in Spanish as well as local service organizations that provide services to the Spanish-speaking community. You can help others while improving your proficiency in Spanish. You can also practice your Spanish with family, friends and co-workers!

4. Listen to music and/or podcasts in Spanish. Three Spanish language radio stations from New York are 93.1 *Amor FM*, *Mega 97.9 FM* and *ESPN Deportes 1050 AM*. Spotify, Amazon and Pandora have music in Spanish. The following website lists the top podcasts in Spanish: <https://www.babbel.com/en/magazine/5-best-podcasts-for-spanish-language-learners/>

5. Purchase an AP Spanish Language and Culture book to help familiarize yourself with the format of the exam and to start preparing for it!

6. Familiarize yourself with the AP exam format as well as look over the test components and old exams on: <https://apcentral.collegeboard.org/courses/ap-spanish-language-and-culture/exam>

7. Review verb tenses and moods (subjuntivo vs indicativo) on conjuguemos.com. Unit 1 will be a review of the present and past subjunctive as well as the imperative. You can log in as a guest – use it without account.
