(if not on the list, don't worry —I'm sure it will be and we always use everything — bring it!)










What an evening!

CoServ had a tornado go through our northern service area last night around 11 p.m. This caused an estimated 50-75 broken poles, affecting approximately 6,700 Members in Valley View/ Sanger/Pilot Point/Aubrey. Our operations crews were able to restore many of these until the storm moved to the opposite side of our area and knocked out another 4,700 Members in the
