This past October, IB Diploma students presented their IB Exhibition to students and teachers in the Center for Equity and Global Leadership. The Exhibitions, an in-depth collaborative inquiry, consisted of presenting three objects that each uniquely answered/probed a question about the abstract nature of knowledge. Students demonstrated effective communication, sharing their complex projects and conversing with teachers and students from all over State High. While each exhibition answered a unique question, and had different/distinct objects, they all shared a similar goal: to explore how the Theory of Knowledge manifests in the world around them. Questions like *Are some types of knowledge less open to interpretation than others?*—addressed by Clarissa Theiss—exhibited a periodic table, a tweet from Donald Trump, and the lyric of a Rush song. Each object answered the question in a distinctive and creative way, impressing both teachers and students at the event. Tate Geiger, an IB Diploma student who answered the question *Who owns knowledge?* found the experience "challenging yet intellectually stimulating"—no doubt the participants at the event shared a similar sentiment.
