


Elementary School Capacities

- Capacities are calculated based on the way each school and each space in each school is being utilized.
- Best practices in school planning establish a 90% utilization rate as the point where elementary school enrollment impacts educational programming and "as designed" facility use. As elementary schools' approach 100% utilization the educational program and experience for children is often markedly different than for children in the same district in elementary schools below 90% utilization.
- All elementary schools in the district were built and, in some cases, additions added to be 3, 3.5. or 4 deep per grade level.
- The growth of federally mandated special education programs has impacted capacities across the district.
- Capacity has decreased by 7.5% as a result of programmatic changes primarily in special education and support programs.

STATE COLLEGE FIFTEEN YEAR HISTORIC ENROLLMENT 2008/09-2022/23



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
