# State College High School Memorial Field

OCTOBER 10, 1914, is an important date in the history of this field, for it was then that a school Board consisting of M. S. McDowell, T. T. Mairs, F. A. Robison, W. S. Glenn, Sr. and J. M. Williams unanimously agreed to purchase the "sink hole" from John Noll for \$3,000. Prior to its purchase by Mr. Noll it had been part of the William Foster farm. Mr. Noll had considered the erection of a laundry on the site.

For twenty years the community thought a great deal about improving "The Hollow" and men, women and children of varying ages used it as a field for play.

On May 15, 1935, the Board of Education voted unanimously to ask the Federal government to assist in the development of the area and on September 25 of the same year, the project was approved by the Federal government. The Board of Education at that time consisted of T. G. Haugh, Mrs. W. G. Edwards, M. M. Babcock, P. B. Breneman and R. H. Breon. The designer was John R. Bracken. The project superintendent for the construction was G. Calvin Graham '19.

The first football game played here was in September, 1937, with Yeagertown as the opponent. Since then this field has been the scene of fifty interscholastic football contests, thousands of supervised games of many types in physical education classes in elementary and secondary grades, as well as religious and patriotic services, band concerts and commencement exercises.

The steel stands seat 1767 and were erected at a cost of \$12,000. The fence cost \$3,600 and the lights \$4,000. The local share of the expense for the work done on the field, 1935-1937, in addition to that just listed was \$12,000.

The present Board of Education consists of W. B. Keeler, R. V. Watkins, Mrs. A. K. Anderson, T. J. Gates, E. H. Jones, John C. Harper, G. D. Kissinger. Since the purchase of this land these individuals in addition to those already listed have served as members of the Board of Education: Mrs. William Frear, M. E. Heberling, C. L. Hollobaugh, S. W. Fletcher, J. F. Harkins, Mrs. Margaret C. Gauger, A. H. Espenshade, W. K. Ulerich, H. R. Kinley, M. W. White, and W. W. Trainer.
