


STUDENTS RECEIVE SEAL OF BILITERACY

Two recent graduates became the first students at Midlakes High School to receive the New York State Seal of Biliteracy for proficiency in more than one language, under a new recognition program offered to students.

Evelyn Acevedo and Austin Sheffield were each recognized with the honor during the June 14 Board of Education meeting for demonstrating mastery in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages, in addition to English.

The Seal of Biliteracy demonstrates the District's commitment to prepare students for college and careers in a global workforce increasingly dependent



on the ability to speak multiple languages.

In May, Acevedo and Sheffield gave a culminating project to a panel of teachers and administrators in Spanish and answered questions from the panel in Spanish.

To be eligible for the Seal of Biliteracy, students must earn at least 3 "points" in English and at least 3 in a World Language by meeting a multitude of requirements such as an 80 or higher on the state's ELA Regents exam, maintaining

an 85 or higher average in their English courses, and maintaining an 85 or higher in their World Language courses. ■

STUDENT PRAISED FOR EMERGENCY RESPONSE

A Midlakes student eyeing a career in law enforcement has been recognized by the Ontario County Sheriff's Office with its "Do the Right Thing" award for quick actions following an accident in April involving a four-wheeler.

Jotniel Mulero, a senior this fall at Midlakes High School, is credited with helping first responders provide care to a victim of the accident. Erin Everson, a teacher at Midlakes, nominated Jotniel for the award.

"I am incredibly impressed with Jotniel's ability to jump into an emergency and handle it with expertise," she wrote in the nomination. "His ability to provide care, translate for the victim, all while staying calm is very mature for a high school student."

Mulero hopes to pursue a career in law enforcement and is enrolled in the criminal justice program at the Finger Lakes Career and Technical Center where he has become certified in Professional Rescue and First Aid.

On the night of the accident, Mulero asked the victim if he could provide care and then called 911 to provide the dispatcher with information on the situation.

With the help of other people nearby, Jotniel drove the victim to an area more accessible for an ambulance. He also provided translation services between the victim and emergency personnel arriving on the scene.

Sheriff Kevin Henderson recognized Mulero during a ceremony on June 15 attended by his family, Everson, Midlakes principal Frank Bai-Rossi, and deputy Bob Holland at the Ontario County complex.

The award highlights youth in Ontario County for exemplary behavior, outstanding accomplishments, and deeds that go beyond typical expectations. The award is intended to inspire other youths to demonstrate similar behaviors while making a difference in the community. ■

Midlakes High School inducted six new members into its chapter of the National Honor Society during a ceremony in the high school auditorium.

Seniors Natalie Bannatyne, Sarah Daunce, Jasmine Hey, Chase Peacock, Trianna Stetzel, and Kalyan VanHout were inducted based on National Honor Society pillars of character, scholarship, leadership, and service to the community.

They join a group of 23 students inducted during a virtual ceremony in November, and were introduced during an in-person ceremony in May that included a special candle lighting and comments from school and District leaders. 

SCHOLAR TEAMS ANNOUNCED

POLICY ON PHOTOS, VIDEOS

The Phelps-Clifton Springs Central School District celebrates the learning and accomplishments of students on District-approved platforms and with local media.

Names, honors, awards, non-graded work, art work, athletic highlights, theatre events, music concerts as well as photographs, videos, and audio recordings may be shared with the media, or posted to the District's social media channels, the District website, and in the *Midlakes Journal*, the District's newsletter.

The release of such information could also be published in other District-approved publications, school, public functions, or in a school yearbook.

A student's name or photo will typically appear with a clear school-related purpose and an intent to highlight students and school-based efforts.

The Federal Family Education Rights and Privacy Act allows school districts to release certain pieces of "directory information" unless a parent or legal guardian exercises their right of refusal.

No action is required for those allowing the District to publish or display this information for non-commercial purposes.

Families wishing to opt out of this policy should submit their desire in writing, along with the student's first and last name, and grade level to the Main Office of the school the student attends. ■

SHOE DRIVE TEACHES IMPORTANT LESSON

A school-wide campaign had families and community members running over to Midlakes Elementary School to donate footwear while helping to teach students an important lesson on empathy.

As part of the school's continuing focus on social-emotional development, dean of students Pete Czerkas and school counselor Anna Corrente wanted students to step into someone else's shoes to better understand how they are feeling.

They took that idea and turned it into a campaign with school staff and families to collect gently worn shoes. Approximately 450 pairs of shoes, sneakers, sandals, and other footwear were dropped off at the school this spring.

"As soon as we put it out there, we had families dropping off garbage bags full of shoes," Czerkas said. "We also had families in need who reached out and said, 'Hey, if you have of these sizes, can you bring my child some or go down and see if there are any shoes that fit them?'"

The response from the community was overwhelming, Corrente said.

"I couldn't believe it," she said. "Pete had a bin and it turned into two bins, and then it was shoes overflowing in the foyer."

Midlakes chapter of the National Elementary Honor Society — 44 students selected for their character, leadership, commitment to service, and academic

success — sprang into action with co-advisers Heather Bradley and Erin Altman helping to store and sort the shoes.

They also organized a two-hour "Super Shoe Saturday" where those in need could discretely search for shoes. While students helped set up and clean up, they did not attend the event.

"After setting up the shoes, the whole driveway was covered and once we got back to school it was almost empty," said Nick Hunter, a sixth-grader and NEHS member. "It makes me happy because all of these kids got brand new shoes and we were able to

help them out."

Nick's twin sister, Natalie, also a member of NEHS, volunteered during the shoe pickup event. "It really made me feel great," she said. "Some people may not be able to afford new shoes and being able to help make their lives better is very rewarding."

NEHS member Jorge Garcia hopes "Super Shoe Saturday" is just the beginning for those in need.

"There are many people that might be struggling, and those shoes will help them in many ways," said Jorge, a sixth-grader and NEHS member. "It can make a difference and it can open up other people's minds to be nice and to help each other.

"There aren't that many people who always do that so if we can demonstrate kindness, other people may follow the same path and do nice things." ■
