Opportunities are available through your school, church, temple, scouting, town and civic organizations. Pick one and get involved!

Participate in religious youth programs

- Teach younger students, participate in youth groups
- Volunteer for service projects, volunteer for summer camps programs
- Volunteer in an elementary school
- Help with homework
- Help with holiday events, fundraisers

Volunteer at a summer camp or recreation program

• Example: Montvale Athletic Association; Woodcliff Lake Basketball Association

Volunteer with senior citizens

- Serve food and drinks, read, play games
- Provide services such as snow removal, leaf raking, shopping
- Example: Sunrise Assisted Living

Work with the homeless

- Work at a homeless shelter
- Participate in a clothing or food drive
