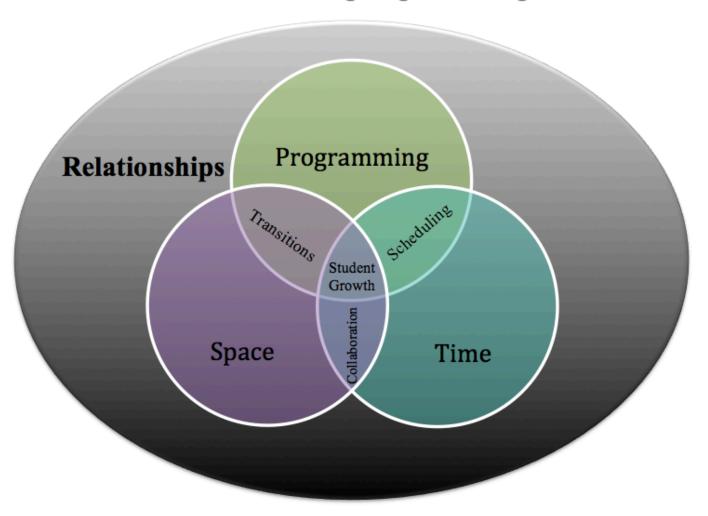

What could this look like for students?

Features:

- Additional class period (from 7 to 8)
- ☐ 30 minute lunch
- ☐ Fewer classes per day than current schedule

What could this look like for teachers?



- Would potentially teach 6 sections over 2 days
- 90 minute block of planning time one day
- □ 45 minute planning/45 minute professional learning community (PLC) time the opposite day
- 15% increase teaching time/45% increase planning time

Features (con.):

Build capacity within current faculty to support initiatives (PLCs, Small Learning Communities, Enrichment/Remediation, Professional Development during the day)

Professional Development

- Continue to build on current work
- Needs to be dedicated to instructional strategies and lesson planning
