Have you ever wondered how an electric car works? Or even seen an electric car? TESLA's new product, the Cybertruck, has a unique shape and a height of 17.44 inches. Find out how a Cybertruck's interior and exterior looks like, and cool facts about the Cybertruck.

Interior/Exterior of a Cybertruck

Let us focus on the extraordinary exterior of a Cybertruck. A Cybertruck's tire measures to be 34.6 inches high and 11.2 inches wide. The body of a Cybertruck is made of ultra-hard stainless-steel. This steel helps to prevent dents, damage and corrosion (means decomposition). This also means that any repairs are simple and quick. The Armor Glass can help shield the effect of a baseball at 70 mph (miles per hour). The Acoustic Glass can help make the space quieter and peaceful. At this point, we will now focus on the interior of a Cybertruck. This polygon-shaped car has a spacious interior with five seats, two in the front row and a three-seat bench in the back row. It also has a touchscreen display in front, and a 24 cm (about twice the length of the long edge of a credit card) touchscreen for rear seated passengers. The Cybertruck also has ambient lighting as well as a 15-speaker audio, wireless charges in the front row, and four USB ports. Hopefully, now you know enough about what a Cybertruck looks like.

GARDENING

Have you ever heard the saying "April showers bring May flowers?" If you have, you probably know that it means that April and May are the perfect months to plant flowers. In this article you will learn some helpful tips to help you grow a garden.

Have you never gardened before? Buying started plants can help you plant a garden without having to grow plants from seed. Great places to get started plants are at Fred Meyer. Fred Meyer has a wide selection of plants to choose from, and started tomatoes, carrots, and many more vegetables. Make sure that when you buy your plants, you look to see if they are frost tolerant or not. If your plant is not frost tolerant, you can wait till late May to plant them, when all danger of frost is gone.

If you want to plant a garden from seed, here are some helpful tips to help your seed garden flourish.

- Follow the directions on the seed packet. These directions will help you plant the seeds in the right spots. If the packet says that your seeds will need full sun, you will need to put them in a sunny spot in your yard.
- Do not lose hope. If your seeds do not come up, just wait longer. Some seeds can take up to a month to sprout! But whatever you do, do not toss your seeds, or give up hope!
- Start your seeds in starter pots. If you bought some started plants, use the containers they came in to plant your seeds. Put them on high ground so the bunnies and other creatures cannot eat them.
- Water your plants daily. If the soil is so dry that when you pour water on the soil, it pools, you will need to water more, but do not water so much that it is damp even on hot days.

If your plants have dead flowers or stems, clip the stems so the plant can make room for other new stems and leaves. This process is called deadheading. Do not deadhead if the leaf is not completely dead, instead do it if the leaf or flowers are drooping and brown.

I hope this article gave you some tips on growing a garden. Remember, always water your plants, but do not water them too much. Have a fun time gardening! 🌱

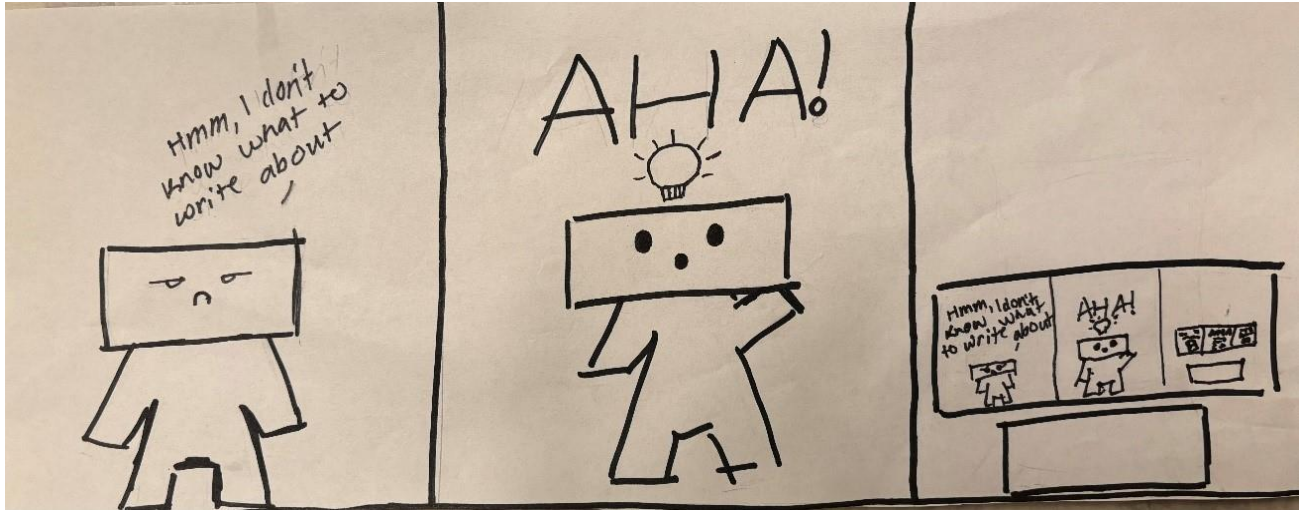
