#### **PAYS Data Point Reminders**

	Grades	Students
1999-2009 every two years	1999: 6-12 (pilot year) 2000-2009: 6, 8, 10, 12	1,600-2,200
2011	6 ,8, 10, 12	1,602

#### **Percent Invalid 2011 = 2.6 (46)**

- Appeared to exaggerate their drug use
- Use of a fictitious drug
- Logically inconsistent patterns of drug use

#### Risk and Protective Factors are scale scores

#### All other scores are percentage use

Overall each % = 16 students 12<sup>th</sup> grade = 3 students per % 10<sup>th</sup> grade = 4 students per % 8<sup>th</sup> grade = 4.5 students per % 6<sup>th</sup> grade = 4 students per %

#### **PAYS** Purpose

- Provide benchmark for alcohol, tobacco, and other drug (ATOD)
- Help indicate whether prevention and treatment programs are achieving their intended results
- Assesses risk and protective factors

## PA Youth Survey Protective and Risk Factors 2011

- Risk is associated with negative behavioral outcomes. It is better to have lower risk factor scale scores
- Protective factors are associated with better behavioral outcomes. It is better to have higher protective factor scale scores

#### **Definitions**

- Parental Attitudes Favorable Toward Antisocial Behavior
  - "How wrong do your parents feel it would be for you to pick a fight with someone"
- Community Disorganization
  - There is existence of graffiti, abandoned buildings, fighting and drug selling, I feel safe in my community
- School Rewards for Prosocial involvement
  - Making students feel appreciated and rewarded for their involvement at school
- School Opportunities for Prosocial Involvement
  - Giving students opportunities to participate in important activities at school

#### **Protective Factors**


- Students in State College Area School District Reported a higher average level of protection than students in Pennsylvania statewide as a whole.
- School Rewards for Prosocial involvement (76)
- School Opportunities for Prosocial Involvement (71)
- Belief in the Moral Order (78)

#### **Risk Factors**


Students in State College Area School District reported a lower average level of risk factors than students in Pennsylvania statewide as a whole.

- Transition and Mobility (50)
- Community Disorganization (46)
- Parental Attitudes Favorable Toward Antisocial Behavior (46)
- Perceived Availability of Handguns (46)




### Risk Factors Community and Family Domain (lower is better)




#### **Risk Factors** School, Peer and Individual Domain




# Past 30 Day Use of Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drugs (ATOD)




#### Past 30 Day Use of ATOD



### Prescription Drug Use Past 30 Day Use








## Community and Family Risk Factors (lower is better)




## School and Individual Risk Factors (lower is better)






### Alcohol – Past 30 Day Use




# Prescription Drug Use Past 30 Day Use
