### Student Wellness and Success Funds

- Initiated in House Bill 66 in July 2019. \$675 million to help districts and schools support academic achievement through initiatives such as mental health, physical health, family engagement, etc.
- Troy City Schools has used these funds to support our position of Social Emotional Learning Coordinator, nurses, counselors and PBIS initiatives. The Miami County ESC has been our Community Partner.
- From 2020 to 2024, this fund has fluctuated from a high in 2021 of \$1,289,000 to a low of \$519,000 in 2023. We received \$551,000 in 2024.
- Our plan for the remainder of the funds for this year is to continue to allocate funds for the position of Social Emotional Learning Coordinator and with any remaining funds, continue to support our counseling and nurse positions.

### Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid

- Disadvantage Pupil Impact Aid provides funding for schools to provide support and wraparound services for our students in similar areas as the Student Wellness and Success Funds.
- Troy City Schools has used the funds in the past to support blended learning, software programs for credit recovery, our TOPS program and FLEX program.
- These funds have also been used to support our staff members who work with our students in these programs.
- These funds normally hover around \$200,000 annually. This year we received a larger amount, \$320,000.
