Dear Student and Parent/Guardian,

Please read this entire packet to assist you with scheduling for the 2024-2025 school year. Course selection is one of the most important processes students undertake during high school. Choosing the correct courses with input from parents, teachers, and your school counselor is critical to an enjoyable and successful experience as you prepare for life after high school. In choosing courses for next year, you must also consider graduation requirements, college admission requirements, career interests, and appropriate academic challenge/progression for you.

Included in this information is a Course Registration sheet. This sheet lists each course a student may take next year by subject. While making your selections, please review the Program of Studies located on the Steele Homepage or the School Counselors' tab on the Steele Website. The Program of Studies includes detailed course descriptions, pre-requisites, graduation requirements, and other essential information to the scheduling process.

In addition to the information found in the Program of Studies, here are some other important things to consider:

- Each full-time student must schedule a minimum of five credits during the school year.
- Student-athletes must meet the OHSAA eligibility requirements.
- Finalized course offerings will be determined by total student enrollment. Courses that have low enrollment could be subject to cancellation.
- Students should carefully consider their choices and fully understand the prerequisites for each course. This is especially important for students interested in CCP courses who have to enroll in LCCC and take the appropriate placement test.
