THE HISTORY

The history of St. Mary Help of Christians School goes back to the turn of the century. Established by Ursuline nuns in 1900 as a boarding school for wealthy young ladies, St. Angela Academy received its name from the Ursulines' founder, St. Angela Merici. In 1906, at the request of their bishop, the Sisters of Charity of Our Lady of Mercy from Charleston, South Carolina, assumed the school's operation. The school then served the educational needs of female boarding students as well as both male and female day students. In 1939, Bernard Baruch, a friend of James Byrnes, helped the Sisters finance a red brick building, an addition to the old school that is now a part of St. Mary Help of Christians Parochial School.

When the Savannah River Plant came to Aiken in 1950, the Catholic population skyrocketed. Bishop Emmet Michael Walsh wanted a parochial grammar school established. Accordingly, the brick building on York Street became St. Mary Help of Christians Parochial School supported by student tuition and the hard work of the Sisters of Charity of Our Lady of Mercy. Thus, St. Angela's private grammar school ceased to be, and only the high school retained that name.

The Sisters continued in the grade school, a parochial school under the jurisdiction and support of St. Mary Help of Christians Parish. In 1955, the Dominican Sisters from Adrian, Michigan took charge of St. Mary Help of Christians School, staffing it until 1970 when they left. Again, the Sisters of Charity of Our Lady of Mercy assumed the administration and continued to provide a Catholic education to those parents seeking one for their children

Embracing the Family

When students enroll, the entire family enrolls. Families have an open invitation to attend Mass, parent prayer, Stations of the Cross, and parent lunches. Annual events that promote family involvement include PTO Events, athletic dinners, community service projects, and annual Memorial Day programs, Christmas programs, and Gingerbread Day. A weekly e-newsletter also keeps families abreast of special events and classroom updates.







Nurturing the Spirit

To teach as Jesus did, by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, is the backbone of the Catholic school system. St. Mary's School teaches the Christian message to form a Christian community and reach out in service to all its neighbors. Through daily prayer, daily religious instruction, weekly Mass, and the performance of some of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, students grow closer to their Creator and learn to recognize Him and His people.

Challenging the Mind

Formulated per diocesan directives, the curriculum at St. Mary's builds on a solid foundation of math and reading skills. The academic program includes language arts (English, spelling, vocabulary development, composition skills, and handwriting), social studies, science, computer literacy, health and safety, and religion. Enrichment is provided through courses in music, art, physical education, foreign language, and library skills.

Supporting the Journey

St. Mary's provides the opportunity to participate in various, enriching academic activities including academic fairs, clubs, Area 1 Spelling Bee, National Geographic's Geography Bee, and various art and essay contests.

Preparing the Way

All students are encouraged to become "good citizens of this world, loving God and neighbor and enriching society with the leaven of the Gospel, and who will also be citizens of the world to come, thus fulfilling their destiny to become saints" (Archbishop J. Michael Miller, CSB, The Holy See's Teaching on Catholic Schools).

Since 1900, the school community has inspired inquisitive students to be thinkers, doers, explorers, builders, debaters, challengers, storytellers and dreamers. At St. Mary's, students are formed to be goal-oriented and community minded, to be resourceful while being thoughtful, and to flourish in faith.

School Accreditation

St. Mary's maintains accreditation by AdvancED/Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Accreditation by AdvancED indicates that St. Mary's meets staffing and curriculum requirements, undergoes a periodic, comprehensive self-study, conducts annual updates, and hosts an accreditation review team of professional educators every five years to visit the school, assess the accuracy of the school's self-study, and provide recommendations for improvement. St. Mary's has been accredited since 1974.

Teacher and Staff Accreditation

St. Mary's primary and elementary or early childhood teachers are certified and have bachelor's or master's degrees, many with coursework beyond the master's degree level. Junior high and "special area" teachers are either certified in their subject areas or are "highly qualified," meaning they have at least a bachelor's degree and have majors or minors in their assigned subjects. St. Mary's professional staff (teachers, librarian, and principal) participate in at least five days of professional development training each school year.





THE ACADEMICS

Kindergarten at St. Mary's

The beginning of a child's academic journey is one of the most exciting – and emotional – stages in a parent's life. While we are eager to send our children out into the world to thrive academically, we also want them to be nurtured, fostered, and supported along the way. With the perfect balance of faithbased and academic instruction, the kindergarten at St. Mary's aims to model what you as a parent teach and value at home.

As children enter kindergarten at a variety of levels, St. Mary's incorporates a semi-structured setting that encourages both listening skills and cooperative play with a balance of active and quiet activities. In addition to "the three Rs," children receive instruction from specialists in physical education, computer literacy, music, art, and foreign language. Kindergartners also explore materials and interact with peers during teacher-guided centers. St. Mary's multi-educational approach instills enthusiasm, creativity, and sensitivity in every child, preparing them for success in elementary school.

Elementary School at St. Mary's

Instilling a lifelong love of learning, devotion to God, and commitment to community is at the heart of the St. Mary's elementary school curriculum. In self-contained classrooms, certified teachers utilize the best instructional practices, the latest classroom technology, and engaging, experiential activities to harness curiosity and teach the fundamentals of math, science, health, social studies, reading, and writing. Recognizing the importance of introducing students to the latest digital technology, the school believes that learning to write in cursive is essential for development, literacy, and self-expression, and include traditional handwriting in our elementary school curriculum.





With a philosophy that a well-rounded education creates well-rounded citizens, elementary students at St. Mary's also receive regular instruction in art, music, physical education, computer literacy, foreign language, and religion. From daily prayer and weekly Mass to daily recess and annual events, students pray together and play together to build a strong sense of community.

Middle School at St. Mary's

Advancing to middle school is an exciting time for students. Greater independence, the opportunity to participate in more extracurricular activities, and the pursuit of personal interests are all rewards of reaching the middle school years. At the same time, more rigorous course work and peer relationships can be challenging at this age. Now more than ever, students need a positive learning environment centered in faith.

The junior high curriculum at St. Mary's is designed to ignite students' passions, guide them through these sensitive years, and prepare them to succeed in high school and beyond. Starting in the sixth grade, students begin to change classrooms every period throughout the day, follow their own schedule, take on more challenging course work, and develop a deeper understanding of God's word. For students meeting the course



requirements, local high schools recognize Spanish 1, German 1, Algebra or Algebra 1 honors, Geometry or Geometry honors, and English 1 or English honors for high school credit.

Aiming to ignite students' passions and their unique gifts from God, a rotating selection of non-graded elective classes is also available to middle school students during 9th period. Teachers select course topics they are passionate about which may include cooking, cake decorating, personal fitness, 3-dimensional art, robotics, book club, sustainable gardening, interior design, Eurogames and more.



THE EXTRACURRICULARS

How We Sing, Swing, Kick, Sprint, Serve and Score

St. Mary's believe that every child has God-given talents, strengths, and interests to be encouraged and cultivated. From participating in a sport to singing in the Youth Choir, there is an extracurricular activity at St. Mary's that suits every student's interests.

Athletics

St. Mary's School sports teams compete in the highly competitive Augusta-Aiken Middle School League. Fifth through eighth grade students with qualifying academics and discipline records may participate.

Fall Sports include girls' volleyball, tennis for boys and girls, golf for boys and girls, and cross country for boys and girls. Winter Sports include basketball for boys and girls with A and B teams, cheerleading for girls, bowling for boys and girls, and pickleball for boys and girls. Spring Sports include soccer for boys and girls, and track and field for boys and girls.

Clubs, Choir & Student Council

In addition to Athletics, St. Mary's School offer several clubs and extracurricular activities for students to show off their talents, learn valuable skills, and contribute to their school and greater community.

National Junior Beta Club

The National Junior Beta Club supports academic excellence, fosters and develops leadership, and aids in character development by encouraging individual achievement as well as community service. Junior Beta Club membership is open to all students in grades 6-8 who maintain an average of at least a B- (83) in each academic subject.

Yearbook Club

The Yearbook Club is open to 6th-8th grade students. Club members learn basic digital design in a web-based program and are responsible for the layout of the yearbook as well as ad sales.

School Choir

Students in the 3rd through 8th grades may try out for the Youth Choir which has a maximum of 25 members due to space in the choir loft. Auditions are held at the beginning of each school year. Choir members sing weekly at our school Mass on Wednesdays and have an opportunity to cantor for the Responsorial and the Alleluia each week at school mass. Choir members also sing special songs during our Christmas and Patriotic programs. Practices are held once a week before school.

Student Council

Student council helps to promote a Christian atmosphere in the school, a harmonious relationship between the faculty and the student body, and the general welfare of the school and its organizations. Students in the 6th through 8th grades may run for a student council position.



THE POSITION

As the spiritual, educational, and managerial leader, the principal plays a vital role in fulfilling the school's mission. Charged with implementing the philosophy, mission, and objectives, the principal oversees the overall academic and business management of the school, ensuring its alignment with Catholic morals, values, and educational standards.
