**Public Comment**

There was no public comment.

**Approval of Minutes**

Mrs. Duchi moved to approve the minutes of the January 20, 2021 meeting. Mr. Fawaz seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

**School Plan for Student Achievement (SRSA)**

Mrs. Debbie Medeiros presented the SRSA for approval and reviewed revisions in the plan. Mrs. Duchi moved to approve revisions to the School Plan for Student Achievement (SRSA). Mr. Bennett seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

**Credential Registration**

Mrs. O’Gorman moved to approve the Credentials presented for registration. Mr. Fawaz seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

**Board Comments**

- Mrs. O’Gorman recently attended a virtual training on trauma and plans to email information from the training to board members.
- CSBA Masters in Governance Update: Mr. Bennett stated that he would like to see a higher percentage of student achievement related items reflected on the county board agenda, if possible. Dr. Enos shared that the Masters in Governance training was informative. Mrs. Duchi stated that it should be required for new board members to attend the Masters in Governance training.

- Dr. Enos recently assisted the Junction Elementary School Board in the appointment of members to their school board. He noted that it was a great experience and it was nice to meet the board members and watch them go through the process of the board meeting.

### **Superintendent's Report**

- Mr. Walters thanked Dr. Enos for assisting the Junction Elementary Board at their special board meeting.
- Mr. Walters reported that COVID-19 discussions continue. Siskiyou County remains in the most restrictive purple tier. SCOE offices will begin to reopen once we are in a less restrictive tier. Mrs. Patty Morris continues to provide Mr. Walters with daily updates on cases in the districts. Mrs. Morris is the SCOE liaison with the public health department and maintains a good relationship with public health and Dr. Stutz, Public Health Officer.
- All districts have submitted their COVID-19 Prevention Plans to Mr. Walters and the plans will be posted to the SCOE website.
- Mrs. Morris and the SCOE school nurses have assisted in two vaccination clinics.
- Mr. Walters shared a *"Spread Kindness"* video by our Yreka High School Special Day Class. Ms. Sydney Wright is the SDC teacher.
- Mr. Allan Carver shared information on the SCOE Science and Watershed Education Program. Mr. Christian Birch and Mr. Jason Singleton provide this program to the school districts. They will be invited to provide a presentation to the board in the coming school year.
- On February 23, Lozano Smith will be conducting a virtual board workshop for board members and school staff.

### **Items for the Next Agenda**

- Mrs. Shannon Eller, Adult Education Director, and Mrs. Bright Nichols-Stock, K-12 Strong Workforce Connection Coordinator, will provide a presentation at the March county board meeting.

# STUDENT SPOTLIGHT



## Florrine Super

### SISKIYOU UNION ADULT - DISTANCE LEARNING SKILLS

Ayukii (Hello),

My name is Florrine Super, Resource Development Manager with Karuk Tribe Housing Authority (KTHA) -Kahtishraam Wellness Center. I have been in this position for a little over 6 years. I would like to share my work history and how Adult Education Pathways has added to my success.

About 10 years ago, while doing some research on making your dreams come true, I was asked to identify my dream job. I thought about a job that would support my family, help others succeed in life, while staying involved in sports and Karuk culture. Not knowing a position that offered what I was looking for in a dream job, I focused on building my skills.

I applied for a job and was declined as I didn't have enough experience in home visits or case management. I did take a job with the Yreka Community Resource Center. This position offered me a chance to help others, as well as to do case management and perform home visits. This position also gave me flexibility to bring in different programs such as a women's support group and cultural activities (Karuk language, beading classes and basket weaving).

Other benefits from this position were community partnerships, supervising volunteers and managing community events. I was blessed with all the skills I needed for my dream job. Then, a management position opened up with the Karuk Tribe Housing Authority. This was an intimidating step for me and I was not sure of a management position, but it offered all the duties that I wanted in a dream job.

Yes, the rest is history as I have been in this position for 6 years. When I first got the job, I only managed the computer center activities. I did not know that my new office would be connected to the new wellness center. After a few years, I was offered the position to oversee all activities including the computer center, fitness center and gym. I was now in my dream job!

What I enjoy in my current position:

Youth-After School Program (tutoring, snacks and activities), Summer Enrichment Program (Art/culture, educational enrichment, and physical activity), and as Chair of Title VI (support success to all Native American students' education at Jackson Street and Evergreen School) and community member for Yreka High School Title VI program. I have a great working relationship with our local schools to assist students.

Adults-Parenting Class (Collaboration with First 5 and Siskiyou Behavioral Health), Further education mainly with College of the Siskiyou, and Me time (Community Potluck lunch, plenty of interaction and activities for our elders and others). Sports and healthy living.

Karuk Culture - We provide Karuk language, beading, weaving, regalia making, and storytelling. My favorite part is working with those who share the knowledge.

Community Events- For the whole community we offer Youth Basketball Camp, Boys Council, Girls Circle, Halloween Haunted Hallway, Christmas with Santa and Easter Egg Hunts. These are some of our favorite events. I have to mention my co-work Vivian Jordan who helps coordinate these events and my supervisor Sara Spence and KTHA board of commissioners who support these activities.

In my position, and as a parent, I needed to know more about Zoom, Google classrooms and other programs that our students use for distance learning. I was happy to hear Adult Education Pathways offered free classes. Taking these classes gave me confidence to host a Zoom meeting, provide Karuk language classes through Google classrooms, and understand what I am looking at when my son shows me his assignments online.

Both presenters showed the parent and teacher side of all programs. They took the time to answer questions and walk through anything that I did not understand. I would recommend Adult Education Pathway programs to the community. At first, I thought you had to be a part of their GED program in order to enroll in Adult Education Pathways. But, I was happy to learn that all their programs are open to all adults who are trying to build their skills for the workforce. You can be employed or unemployed. Adult Education Pathways is free and offers professional knowledge. I can now help other parents, and myself, maneuver through programs our children are using to further their education.

### Meat CUTTER TRAINING

This introductory course was designed to provide basic knowledge of meat cutting and focuses on meat cutting safety, knife skills and the various cuts of beef, pork, chicken and lamb.

The first class covered pork and each student was able to use their newly developed knife skills to make pork chops out of a whole pork loin. The second class focused on beef with an emphasis on identifying the various cuts, as well as, grading those cuts. They also learned the proper way to cut flat iron steaks, cubed steaks and how to tie knots for a rolled beef roast.

This course is in partnership with Black Fox Timber Management Group, Inc. and leads to an occupational skills certification and potential of direct job placement!

Their Bus Driver Training Program is starting on April 6th. The bus driver training program is 3 days (20 hours) of classroom training with an additional 20 hours of behind the wheel driving. The beginning of January, Yreka Adult School offered a Tax Preparer Certification training class for anyone who was interested in becoming a tax preparer. We had the opportunity to partner with Siskiyou Works, VITA and JEDI to offer this course.

They also held a CBEST Preparation class in January designed to help anyone who was interested in taking the CBEST, which is a required test for becoming a substitute teacher. Leah Diggle prepared students with the necessary curriculum to assist with taking this test. We plan to offer another CBEST Preparation course in the late spring.

This is a great course if you are interested in becoming a substitute teacher. There is a shortage in our area of substitutes, and at Yreka High School we pay \$135 per day for our substitutes.

We held our first Meat Cutting Class the last weekend of January. Our program partnered with Siskiyou Works/Ore Cal to provide an amazing opportunity for anyone who was interested in this industry. Meat cutters are needed in our area at both grocery stores and local butchers. Grant Eastlick and Heather Zanotto provided students with their Food Handlers Certificate and provided the opportunity for students to learn the necessary skills to enter into the workforce.

Yreka Adult School has hired two more teachers to assist with providing classes for those who are interested in taking the GED test or getting their high school diploma.

We understand that most adults still need to work so we provide the opportunity to meet with teachers in the evening or on a Saturday. Also all of our classes are free, and we work hard to provide courses that work around a working schedule. You can call our office at: 530-842-6151 ext 150 or come into our facility at 701 N. College of the Siskiyous is partnering with Ore-Cal Resource Conservation and Development Council, Siskiyou Works, and Habitat for Humanity to offer a construction class in Spring 2021. The goal of this program is to upskill individuals to work during the fire rebuild.

This program will be offered in two stages. There is a required 32-hour Work Readiness course covering Job Search, Safety, and Construction Methods. April through June will be the Basic Construction Fundamentals course to build the Tiny House. The build will be outdoors under cover and then trailered to its final home.

The classes will be 6pm – 9pm on Tuesday & Thursday. There will be some Saturday classes 9am – 3pm.
