McCloud High School

The first high school in McCloud opened in 1912. Classes were held in the rear of the grammar school building, located at the end of Siskiyou Avenue. The building still stands and is now a market place.

In 1923, a new high school was built on Broadway Street. In 1959, this building was sold to the McCloud River Lumber Company. In 1959-60, the present high school was erected on Campus Way. The McCloud High School has always been part of the Siskiyou Union High School District.

She obtained her teaching credential and then taught for several years at Yreka High School. During that time she lived with a family named "Ackerman", who owned the pharmacy in Yreka. She left Yreka in 1937, taught for two years in Chowchilla, married, and resumed teaching in 1948 at Half Moon Bay High School, retiring in 1972."
