Rather than lament the passing of summer, I appreciate the annual feeling of reinvigoration and energy that July and August give us. That physical and mental renewal is what positions us for a strong start to the Rye Neck 2022-23 school year.



Many aspects of the foundation

for a successful student year were laid during our previous year. Working with our community, the Board of Education and adminsitration created a budget that reinforced our educational technology capabilities, provided professional staff for appropriate class size, and maintained the extracurricular options that our students enjoy. The budget also allowed us to enhance our school security and reorganize our administrative team, all while adhering to the NY State tax cap for an 11th straight year.

Of course, the goal of any budget is to enable us to follow through on Rye Neck's mission: focusing on a strong, diverse academic foundation earned through a challenging instructional program; encouraging students to take ownership of their life-long learning, think critically, and master their ability to communicate; and stressing good character, promotion of ethical behavior, and an appreciation of their multicultural world community. Wil Siegel, our new Director of Pupil Personnel Services, will be responsible for our students with disabilities and special services staff and he will also head our mental wellness efforts. The beginning of a school year requires a great deal of coordination, which makes the staff days prior to the arrival of our students critical and we were fortunate to have had a full week to prepare this year. Our new staff members came in on August 29th for a set of specific activities to get started, including our annual "new staff bus tour" to help familiarize them with our community. The veteran staff returned on August 30th. During the remainder of the week, we trained on new technologies, policies, and programs. For example, all staff received training on recognition of student mental health issues from our psychologists, and both bullying prevention and safety and security from our administrative team. Our custodial and grounds staff put finishing touches on the building and grounds, our clerical staff sent new-year communications, while teachers and assistants decorated each building to make sure they are welcoming environments for our students.

I am eager to see our students on opening day and we are all poised to help them learn, achieve and lead.

## **Tenure Candidates**

The Rye Neck School District is committed to recruiting and retaining excellent teachers. There are several mechanisms in place to ensure that our professional staff meets this goal, including ongoing feedback from the superintendent, principals, department supervisors, directors and chairs.

Each of these professionals brings a unique and important perspective to the process and works individually with nontenured teachers to foster professional development and provide support. These professional relationships help staff members reflect on their practice, grow and make appropriate adjustments.

From a formal perspective, district administrators utilize a comprehensive evaluation process, frequently observing and evaluating each new staff member to offer suggestions, monitor progress and assess improvement. A four-year probationary period is required before new teachers/administrators receive tenure and a three-year period for teachers who have previously held tenure in another public school district in New York State.

Parents can provide valuable insights and should do so, first to the staff member directly, since this feedback would be most helpful to him/her. Once parents have spoken to the teacher, they may also wish to share their thoughts with the individual building principal or supervisor.
