Rising CM1 – CM2

Summer is a wonderful time for a child to discover new things and to view the world from a different lens. Summer reading can be a part of that discovery, and can help children develop lifelong reading habits at the same time.

The elementary English teachers ask that each child read two books either from the following lists, arranged by grade and by difficulty level, or of their own free choice.

Rising CM1 - CM2 students are encouraged to create a “one pager” reading project based on their book. Please refer to the attached instructions and documents to create your project. We will display all of the projects on a Summer Reading Bulletin Board.

As the students’ abilities and comfort levels with the English language vary greatly, we ask that parents use discretion in managing summer reading activities with their children. Sometimes children will be happy to understand a few words on each page. Pictures will play an important role in comprehension of the text, particularly in our beginner readers. In other cases, students may wish to challenge themselves by selecting books that are more difficult.

Rising CM1 and CM2

Fiction One Pager:

For your one pager, you will write and draw a bit about your summer reading book! Make sure to use a lot of creativity and color! If you read a fiction book, here are the instructions for your one pager:

- 1 In the middle circle, write the title and author of your book. Draw a picture (or several small images) to represent the story.
- 2 In the characters box, draw a picture and/ or write about 1 - 3 characters from your story.
- 3 In the setting box, draw a picture and/ or write about an important setting from the story.
- 4 In the "My favorite part" box draw a picture/ and or write about your favorite part of the story.
- 5 In the "A question for the author" box, write a question that you would like to ask the author of the book.

Nonfiction One Pager:

For your one pager, you will write and draw a bit about your summer reading book! Make sure to use a lot of creativity and color! If you read a nonfiction book, here are the instructions for your one pager:

- 1 In the middle circle, write the title and author of your book. Draw a picture (or several small images) to represent the story.
- 2 In the main idea box, draw a picture of and/ or describe what your book is all about.
- 3 In the picture/ diagram/ timeline box, draw a picture, diagram, or timeline representing an important topic or lesson from your story.
- 4 In the vocabulary box, write and define at least three new vocabulary words. Bonus: draw some small pictures to help us understand!
- 5 In the "A question for the author" box, write a question that you would like to ask the author of the book.

- 1 Dans le cercle du milieu, écrivez le titre et l'auteur de votre livre. Dessinez une image (ou plusieurs petites images) pour représenter l'histoire.
- 2 Dans la case de l'idée principale, dessinez une image et/ou décrivez le sujet de votre livre.
- 3 Dans la case image/diagramme/chronologie, dessinez une image, un diagramme ou une chronologie représentant un sujet important ou une leçon de votre histoire.
- 4 Dans la case vocabulaire, écrivez et définissez au moins trois nouveaux mots de vocabulaire. Bonus : fais des petits dessins pour nous aider à comprendre !
- 5 Dans la case "Une question pour l'auteur", écrivez une question que vous aimeriez poser à l'auteur du livre.

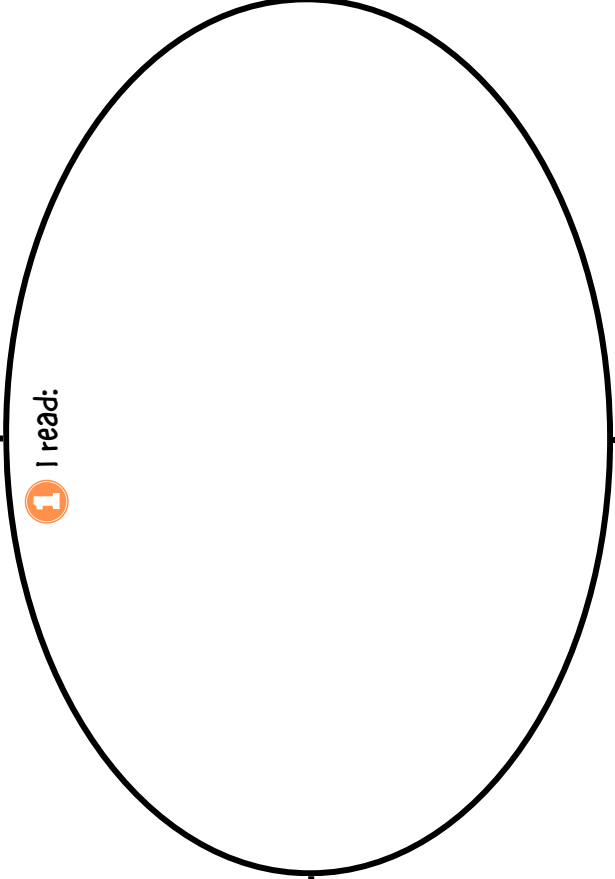
