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

DIRECTORS' NOTES

This script is a 46 year old time capsule. A.R. Gurney wrote and produced it in 1970. His satirical commentary on his people - the New England WASPs - is about their habit of clinging to their antiquated way of life, and how it was contributing to the fracturing of the country.

It was the late 60s. Urban riots, deteriorating race relations, class stratification, changing gender roles: the chaos that Gurney saw in his time led him to not only look back on how we got there, but where he thought we'd end up. His dystopian "future" of the 70s and 80s is a military occupation brought on by total social breakdown.

Today, it seems as though our politics are polarized beyond repair, but if we compare today with the turmoil of the 60s, we're actually in better shape. Gurney envisioned a state of martial rule and a loss of individual rights. The dark and often ironic vignettes highlight the hopes and fears of mid-century New England WASPs, and in the process reveal that our hopes and fears today are not all that different than they were then. The specifics of Gurney's work shows us who we were and how we got there. The themes show us who we are and who we might be.

This is an ambitious work for educational theatre. Thank you for the support that allows us to venture into more meaningful works and greater challenges. Thanks also to the over fifty students who perform, design, and produce this show. It's a privilege to work with you


